### THE GREAT WAVE



In 1854, Commodore Matthew Perry, of Newport, Rhode Island, at the request of President Millard Fillmore, created an opening to trade with Japan through gunboat diplomacy. In other words, as captain of ten battle frigates, Perry made an offer that the Japanese could not refuse. In doing so, he and his men brought back tales and artifacts from a culture wholly different from anything that nineteenth century America had ever known.

By the 1870's, the decade after the Civil War, Newport was changing, too. Flush with massive amounts of Gilded Age money and newly made millionaires, the resort's increasing popularity created within its wealthy, Old Guard, moneyed people a sense of listlessness and boredom. New places and adventures had to be found. Not least among these places of elite desire was Japan, with its culture of thousands of years, relatively untouched by Western sensibilities.

John la Farge, the painter and stained glass designer, made the journey, as did Henry Adams, the author and collector, as well as Percival Lowell, the noted astronomer, and Charles Longfellow, the rakish son of the poet. Their cultural influences eventually went far, to T.S. Eliot, Frank Lloyd Wright, Douglas MacArthur, and beyond.

*The Great Wave: Gilded Age Misfits, Japanese Eccentrics, and the Opening of Japan*, by Christopher Benley, is the story of the cross pollination between a go-go nineteenth century America and the staid, cautious Japan. So much of the story resides still in the arts of Newport and Cambridge, Boston and New York. Many influential people, on both sides of the world, were motivated by the depth of learning that resulted.

We'll read and discuss *The Great Wave*, particularly in the context of its effects upon art and Newport, over four two-hour sessions.

## THE ORIGINAL PARTY ANIMAL

What can be said about Ted Turner? Perhaps, that he manages the largest herd of buffalo in the world and that he once owned the biggest tract of land in the United States. He also founded CNN, a cable network created from scratch. To provide programming for his first-ever tv superstation, the young mogul bought the Atlanta Braves, winning a World Series in the bargain.

Knowing Rhode Island well, Turner cemented his reputation as an unpredictable character early on. In the 60's, for example, while attending Brown, he was expelled for conduct unbecoming a Kappa Sigma. All was forgiven by the late 80's, when he was conferred an honorary degree.

Ted's genius extended to the yacht *Courageous*, a twelve meter bought from a rival and skippered to victory by Turner himself in the 1977 America's Cup. That celebration renewed Newport's reputation as both a sailing and a party town. Defying categorization, this tireless entrepreneur has gone on to make himself a world authority on nuclear weaponry as well as a major contributor to the United Nations. His willpower is the stuff of legend.

## ROSE, JACKIE, CAROLINE, ETHEL.....and More

*The Kennedy Women*, as the title implies, is a book composed of the life stories of women who married into the most famous dynastic family in American history. The saga begins in the nineteenth century with the marriage of Bridget Murphy to Patrick Kennedy and continues to the present day as we explore the careers of Maria, Rory, and Caroline.



No understanding of the Kennedy family would be possible without clear reference of the role of its matriarch, Rose. Daughter of a Boston mayor and wife of a tycoon, she, more than any other, ushered the family into prominence and into survival at the top. She was the dynamic, observant wife and homemaker that millions of women modeled themselves upon. Mother to war heroes, media stars, senators, and a president, she lived for a century and saw more than her share of triumph and tragedy.

Jacqueline Bouvier married into the family of JFK and established herself as the most memorable First Lady of the modern era. She came along at a time when women of her level of talent and ability were only beginning to gain acceptance within the popular culture. Ethel Skakel Kennedy, wife of Robert and widow-through-violence like Jackie, had a much more difficult time finding popular support. Ultimately, however, our nation found itself on what seemed to be a first name basis with many female Kennedys.

In his serial biography and memoir of the Kennedy women, Laurence Leamer establishes a narrative concerning the history and culture of a group that has been formative of American social, political, and cultural life for a century and more.

## PAPA HAS A BRAND NEW BOOK

The life and legendary loves of Ernest Hemingway are by now well-known. Less understood are the origins of the outsized character that became Papa Hemingway. He had not always been a writing adventurer, preeminent at the top of Paris society. In fact, at the end of the Great War, Hemingway was little more than a badly wounded aspiring journalist.

Lesley Blume discovered the narrative progression for her nonfiction memoir of Hemingway and his pals in the Paris and Pamplona of the 20's---after she'd stumbled upon a photograph. Pictured next to the writer in some café suitable for conviviality and the tabloids was Lady Duff Twysden, a super lithe, super sexy, soon-to-be divorced mystery lady. From her twentieth-first century perspective, Blume was intrigued. Could Twysden have been the inspiration for Lady Brett Ashley, and therefore, by extension, for *The Sun Also Rises*? For that matter, is Robert Cohn actually Harold Loeb, Hemingway's sometime tennis partner and romantic rival for Twysden's affections? And finally, is the creation of the Jake Barnes character indicative of a break with his own past that allowed Hemingway to create, in real life, the man who became Papa?



Thus, we have in Blume's *Everyone Behaves Badly* a story structure for two books: one, a modern inquiry into the social and moral fabric of a lost generation, and the other, a dissection of personalities who, consciously or not, inspired a masterpiece.

We'll read *Everyone Behaves Badly* and discuss it in the context of *The Sun Also Rises* over four two-hour sessions. It is recommended that participants read or re-read *The Sun Also Rises* in advance of the first class.

## PREPARING FOR THE SAT

This course focuses on SAT test-taking skills and strategies. Recent studies have revealed that training and familiarization in test-taking techniques can increase scores. While no guarantees or predictors can be made, students will be brought to a level of familiarity and ease to reduce the sort of anxiety which lowers performance. Model tests will be taken repeatedly to orient students to the format of the test. The course is designed for 11th and 12th graders and consists of eight 2-hour coaching sessions of intensive preparation for the November 4th SAT. # Summer Safaris

## Trips and tours for all ages and interests!

Barrington Community School trips are open to all adults, regardless of residence, and children who are accompanied by a parent or designated caretaker. Deluxe lavatory-equipped motor coaches are used for all trips unless otherwise noted. All trips depart from the parking lot behind Barrington Town Hall. Also available: Providence pickups for Boston, the Berkshires and other points north; Warwick pickups for all New York and some Connecticut trips – see specific trip destinations for details.

To register for trips, forward the following to Barrington Community School, Box 256, Barrington, R.I. 02806: A completed registration form found in this flyer, a **separate** check for each trip for which registration is being made, and a stamped, self-addressed **business size** envelope for EACH trip for confirmation and trip materials, which will be mailed no earlier than 2-3 weeks prior to each trip.

**Payment** must be received in full, or by deposit where noted, with registrations, which are processed in the order in which they are received. Driver tips are included in all trip fees. Trip fees also include the costs of planning, promotion and operation of the programs described. Trip fees are priced at Member and Non-Member rates.

**Refunds:** Refunds will be given, less a \$15.00 per person handling fee for day trips (more for overnights/ excursions), only if the trip is fully subscribed and a replacement reservation can be made from the waiting list. We regret we must enforce this policy, but the escalating costs of admission tickets and motor coach transportation dictate this position.

**Providence pick-ups:** We are pleased to offer pick-ups from Providence for our non-East Bay friends. Please note that for all trips with destinations in the Berkshires (Tanglewood, Stockbridge, Williamstown, et al) the Providence pick-up is the Stop & Shop parking lot: Branch Avenue exit (#24) off I-95. Turn left at the end of the exit and proceed to the Stop and Shop parking lot where you will be picked up on the left side of the lot.

For destinations towards Boston, Salem, and northern New England, pick-ups will be at the Shaw's Plaza (Chili's location) off North Main Street: Take the bus terminal exit, #25 on I-95; proceed to North Main, turn left at Ann Mary Street, the first traffic light at Cox Communications building, go down the hill to the next light and turn right onto Collyer. At the bottom of that hill, turn left into the large parking lot.

**WAVE HILL & UNTERMAYER GARDENS**

**Wednesday, June 21**



Who knew the Gates of Paradise and the Garden of Eden were just a few miles north of Manhattan? These grand-sounding biblical names describe just a few of the features at Untermyer Park & Gardens, called "America's most spectacular garden." A restoration project has been underway to restore them to their former 1920s glory, including a walled garden based on the Garden of Eden, the finest example of a Persian garden in the western hemisphere; a

vista modeled after a Villa d'Este view on Lake Como leading down to the Hudson River; and a Temple of Love project with rock garden and waterfall. This is a unique opportunity to observe horticultural restoration, advised by the world-famous designer Marco Polo Stufano, who transformed the gardens of Wave Hill, just 5 miles south. Gardens here at Wave Hill include the Aquatic Garden, Connifer Slope, herb gardens, monocot, shade and perennial gardens. ### Flora/Fauna: The Naturalist Impulse in American Art

Friday, July 22

Florence Griswold Museum, Old Lyme, CT



While we have visited the Florence Griswold Museum many times in our long history, each journey has been different, focusing on special exhibitions, events and course tie-ins. This summer is no different, as we travel once again to Old Lyme to view the beautiful exhibition, *Flora/Fauna: The Naturalist Impulse in American Art*. Organized by the Florence Griswold Museum, it will feature 70 works surveying the history of artist-naturalists and environmentally-conscious artists in America from the 19th through the mid-20th centuries. Exploring the intersections of fine art with natural history, it begins with the Peale family, John James Audubon and their contemporaries and examines the naturalist impulse in works by the Hudson River School, American Pre-Raphaelites, and American Impressionist artists. Highlighting Impressionists such as Childe Hassam, Willard Metcalf, and Harry Hoffman, the exhibition will showcase the importance of naturalist subjects for artists at the Lyme Art Colony, centered at Florence Griswold's boarding house in Old Lyme. These artists sought inspiration in nature while also contributing to the conservation movement in the Connecticut River Valley, still vital today. The exhibition's coda will feature select 20th-century artist-naturalists such as Old Lyme resident Roger Tory Peterson, creator of widely-used bird guides.




Inspired by the Museum's extensive collection of Willard Metcalf's work, including his rare and intact collection of bird eggs, moths, and butterflies, the project will contribute new scholarship on the little explored relationship between Impressionism and natural history.

The exhibition will also highlight the undervalued contribution of women to the genre, showcasing the museum's rich collection of Fidelia Bridges' work with a rarely seen portfolio of her sketches and studies of nature. Works on view will be drawn from the Museum's permanent collection and also include loans.

A guided tour of the museum, house and gardens will fill our morning with breath-taking views, artworks, and history at every turn. Luncheon with choice of entrée at the historic Old Lyme Inn is included, and we'll take a short drive through the center of Old Lyme to view some of the spots forever immortalized in the museum's holdings. Our Oyster Farm Tour begins at Matunuck Oyster Bar with introductory information about East Matunuck Barrier Beach, Succotash Salt Marsh and Potter Pond Estuary. Perry Raso of Matunuck Oyster Farm will discuss aquaculture and fisheries on a global scale and on a local scale. We'll then go to the seven acre shellfish farm in Potter's Pond. This educational tour takes about 90 minutes, and reveals how shellfish are cultivated in local waters. We'll also see the different species of shellfish in many different stages of growth.



The tours and oyster farm were started with help from RI Sea Grant Reed Initiative funded project "The Ocean State Aquaculture Education Project" in 2002. Although the grant has expired, the tours continue because of the commitment of the farm to the educational opportunities they provide and to increase people's understanding of

## CRUISING the THIMBLE ISLANDS

Another favorite returns!

If you've lived in southern New England all of your life but never heard of the Thimble Islands, you're not alone! And this is fine with the locals, among whom are cartoonist Garry Trudeau and his wife, Jane Pauley, who own a house on 10-acre Governors Island. The Thimbles are an archipelago of 100 to 365 islands, depending on whether you count small rocks, reefs, ledges and sandbars that surface at low tide, off Branford, east of New Haven. The largest, Horse Island, owned by the Peabody Museum of Natural History at Yale University, is 17 acres. They look like chunks of coastal Maine — with pink granite bases and lush covers of hardwoods, pines and thickets — that have somehow ended up in Long Island Sound. Most locals agree that their name derives from the thimbleberry, a type of black raspberry that

used to grow on them in abundance. To learn all about the islands and their history as well as folklore, we'll travel to Stony Creek, the nearest mainland village, where we will take a shuttle bus to the dock for our late morning narrated cruise. First discovered in 1614 by Adrien Block, these islands were used for everything from quarrying granite to bootlegging. We'll hear stories of people and events that were told nearly 50 years ago, including the islands' farming and fishing communities, the Mattabesec Indians, who made these islands a favorite summer camping ground and even Captain Kidd, who sailed here in 1665, and who found the many inlets the perfect hiding place for his treasure.

After the cruise, we'll enjoy a delicious luncheon buffet at a local seafood restaurant. Barrington departure will be at 8:00AM, followed by a Warwick pickup at 8:20; return will be by 4:30PM.


**The Wharton Comedies** **Sunday, September 10**

Lewis won the Pulitzer Prize for his biography of Edith Wharton, and in Shakespeare and Company's 40th season we celebrate her heritage and Dennis Krausnick's many adaptations of her works with these two delightfully pointed and charming social satires. In *Roman Fever*, Grace and Alida reminisce about the Colosseum, having known each other so well for their entire lives, or so they think. *The Fullness of Life* unveils in charming fashion that the afterlife, while enchanting, may not be all that it's cracked up to be. Come relish the language and perspective of this brilliant writer and her faithful adapter. Tea and levity will be served.

**Ocean Liners: Glamour, Speed, and Style** **Friday, September 15**  
**Peabody Essex Museum, Salem, MA**

Bradlee, 1928, M11215. © Peabody Essex Museum From the mid-19th century through the mid-20th century, ocean liners were floating show-cases of technology, opulence and social sophistication. As icons of modernity and aspirational living, artists, engineers, architects and passengers all vied for influence and access in the creation and enjoyment of these man-made islands at sea.

Ocean liners were intricately constructed pieces of culture — in the appearance of their design, the elegance of their engineering and the division of their social space — and each with its own distinct personality. Drawing from international institutions and private collections, the exhibition brings together nearly 200 works including paintings, sculpture, models, furniture, lighting, wall panels, textiles, fashion, photographs, posters and film. The exhibition is co-organized with the Victoria and Albert Museum, London. Our visit at one of the country's preeminent museums

begins with a guided tour of this special exhibition. Participants will also have the opportunity to view other special exhibitions on view, (*Importing Splendor: Luxuries from China*, *Double Happiness: Celebration in Chinese Art*, *Raven's Gifts: Native Art of the Northwest Coast*, and the compelling installation *Stickwork*), as well as the museum's vast permanent collection of artistic treasures from around the world; this includes Asian Export Art, marine art, and American decorative art.



**20th CENTURY ICONS: JFK & HEMINGWAY** **Tuesday, October 10**

The John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum has announced a year-long celebration to honor the 100th anniversary of the birth of President John F. Kennedy. Born in Brookline, Massachusetts on May 29, 1917, President Kennedy was the youngest president ever elected to office. To commemorate his centennial year, the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum is spearheading a series of year-long events and initiatives aimed at inspiring new generations to find meaning and inspiration in the enduring values that formed the heart of the Kennedy presidency. *JFK 100: Milestones & Mementos*, chronicles the historic milestones in the President's career and administration, as well as the events of his personal and family life, and features a compelling selection of items drawn mostly from the Kennedy Library's collections. Highlights of the exhibition include family items from his childhood and adolescence; a flag from PT 109 (the boat commanded by JFK during World War II); items relating to the Cuban Missile Crisis, and notes jotted down by the President in preparation of his landmark address to the nation on civil rights.



In addition, a private visit to the library's Hemingway Collection is offered to supplement the BCS course, *Papa Has A Brand New Book*, which focuses on *The Sun Also Rises*. For course details, see page 3. The Ernest Hemingway Collection is the generous gift of Mary Hemingway, Ernest Hemingway's widow, to the Kennedy Library; it spans Hemingway's entire career, and contains ninety percent of existing Hemingway manuscript materials, making the Kennedy Library the world's principal center for research on the life and work of this author. Notable items in the collection are more than 1000 manuscript items, ranging from one-line fragments to thousand-page manuscripts, Hemingway's first hand-written draft of *The Sun Also Rises*, family scrapbooks, Hemingway's leather briefcase with stamps revealing where and how he traveled, Hemingway's personal collection of bullfighting material, several thousand letters, photos and artworks.

An overnight trip to the beautiful Berkshires features some of the area's important and best-known venues. One of Tanglewood's Festival's most beloved traditions, the ever-popular Tanglewood on Parade, offers a full day of musical activities for the entire family, culminating in an 8 p.m. concert in the Shed featuring all of the festival's orchestras performing in a single concert. Boston Pops Conductor Keith Lockhart and Pops Laureate John Williams, along with conductors Charles Dutoit, Bramwell Tovey, and BSO Assistant Conductor Moritz Gnann lead the BSO, Boston Pops, and Tanglewood Music Center Orchestra in a program of works including Copland's *Fanfare for the Common Man*; Copland's Piano Concerto, featuring 2017 Koussevitzky Artist Garrick Ohlsson; the suite

from Kodály's *Háry János*; the Mendelssohn's *Hebrides Overture*; and music from John Williams' scores to *Jurassic Park*, *Minority Report*, and *Jaws*. The traditional Tanglewood on Parade finale, *Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture*, closes the concert, followed by fireworks over the Stockbridge Bowl. Various events, including Music Center student concerts, family activities and more are offered continuously throughout the afternoon.

We've included a visit to Stockbridge, with luncheon at the Red Lion Inn, and an extended visit at the Francine and Sterling Clark Art Institute in Williamstown, the venue for in-depth visits to special exhibitions, as well as more time for the museum's impressive permanent collection. Of particular note this summer are two exhibitions related to the works of Helen Frankenthaler (1928-2011), "As in Nature: Helen Frankenthaler Paintings" and "No Rules: Helen Frankenthaler Wood Cuts." The former exhibition comprises a selection of large paintings by Helen Frankenthaler from the 1950s through the 1990s, focusing on nature as a longstanding inspiration. The paintings represent the full range of styles and techniques that she explored over five decades of work; while all are primarily abstract, they also contain allusions to landscape, demonstrating how Frankenthaler's delicate balance between abstraction and a nuanced responsiveness to nature and place developed and shifted over time.

Also on view will be *Picasso: Encounters*, which explores Pablo Picasso's (1881-1973) interest in and experimentation with large-scale printmaking throughout his career. With important paintings on loan from the Musée National Picasso-Paris, the exhibition addresses his expansive formal vocabulary, the narrative preoccupations that drove his creative process, the often-neglected issue of the collaboration inherent in print production, and the muses that inspired him, including the many women in his life.

As interest in the painter Sir Lawrence Alma-Tadema (1836-1912) surges, the Clark offers insight into the work of painter Sir Lawrence Alma-Tadema (1836-1912), specifically one of his most successful and distinctive artistic endeavors—the design of a music room in the Greco-Pompeian style for the New York mansion of financier, art collector, and philanthropist Henry Gurdon Marquand (1819-1902). Marquand was one of the founders of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Alma-Tadema designed the decoration of a Steinway grand piano (now in the Clark's collection) along with a matching suite of furniture and textiles for the room. The designs of the artist, the exquisite craftsmanship of the suite, and the taste and discrimination of the patron combined to create one of the most extraordinary rooms of the Gilded Age. Orchestrating Elegance brings together twelve pieces of the original furniture suite, along with paintings, ceramics, textiles, and sculpture from the room, for the first time since Marquand's estate was auctioned in 1903. Additional material provides background and context to examine the design and execution of the music room project.

The Clark's impressive collection of French Impressionist works alone make a visit imperative for art lovers. We will explore the galleries and this fascinating property independently, but background information and guidance will be provided on the motor coach on the trip.
