John was instrumental in developing community support for people with mental illness, and especially took a lead role in the development of the Manitoba Mental Health Research Foundation in the early 70s. John was passionate about his wife. He was a committed and understanding father. He felt a spiritual connection with nature, and spent many hours in quiet observation, but he also enjoyed his NFL football.
