SCOTT, Angus Cheever, at Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto, on Thursday July 5, 2001, beloved husband of Lorna (Hungerford), father of The Reverend Peter J.C. Scott (Elizabeth), Douglas H. Scott (Jennifer), Sally P.M. Swanborough (Jay), Angus M.B. Scott (Heather) and Robert N.S. Scott. Brother of Douglas S. Scott, Q.C. of Ancaster, and Alison M. Scott of Ancaster. Grandfather of Peter's children, Rebecca and Ethan, Douglas' children, Charlotte, Olivia and Juliet, Sally's children, Lulu and Maud. Son of the late Silas Warren Cheever Scott and Marie Louise (Morris). Attended Hillfield School, Ridley College, Trinity College at the University of Toronto and Emmanuel College at Cambridge University. Headmaster of Trinity College School, Port Hope, 1962-83. Angus Scott passed away in Toronto on July 5th, 2001. A native of Dundas, ON, he is buried in the family plot in the Hamilton Cemetery beside his father and grandfather.

He entered the U of T, from Ridley College in St Catharines, in 1943 and was attested into the UNTD that October. At the beginning of 1944, he went on active service, joining the RNVR at HMS ST VINCENT (FAA Shore Establishment - Gosport) and ultimately qualifying as a Fleet Air Arm Pilot in the UK. He transferred into the RCN(R) and in 1947 was a SLT(P) attached to STAR. He returned to U of T, graduating with a BA in Modern History in 1949 while still attached to STAR. He was also attached to #1 Training Air Group at SHEARWATER in 1949. He taught for a year at Appleby College in Oakville and was a LT(P) RCN(R) prior to going to Cambridge Univ in the UK, obtaining an MA there in 1952.

Returning home, Angus Scott joined the Staff of Trinity College School in Port Hope, in 1952. In 1955 he was a HouseMaster and in 1959 was Ass't Headmaster. After a one year Leave of Absence to attend Harvard, he became Headmaster of TCS in 1962 and remained as such until retirement in 1983.

During his time at Trinity, Angus Scott, through a mutual friend, became a canoeing partner of Pierre Elliot Trudeau, accompanying him on a trip down the Coppermine River in 1962. In 1975 PM Trudeau dropped in (literally) on Angus Scott, at Trinity College, in a Gov't Huey. Angus' son Peter, an Anglican Priest in Orangeville, was and still is an avid northern canoeist.
