Welcome Back!



Save your Labels and Raise Money for our School!



This Year's Fundraiser for PTA

This year's fund-raiser for McMahon School will again be selling products from Meadow Farms, as well as Crystal Journey Candles. Two years ago when we did this fund-raiser the PTA made an \$18,000 profit on just the Meadow Farms products (50% profit on all sales). The candles are new this year and hopefully a nice addition. All the prizes are provided from Meadow Farms, which mean less out of pocket for the PTA and more money in for the students. Along with the prizes, 8 life-size Sponge Bob pillows will be provided as prizes to the high volume sellers for each grade. Sponge Bob will be visiting each class during the fundraiser to get the students excited. The fundraiser will kick off on Monday September 15th. Terry Tatlock, a representative from Meadow Farms, will be at the school explaining to the students what they will need to do. A display of samples will be in the school lobby for both parents and student to view. All orders and money will be due back to the school between October 6 and October 8. Reminders will be sent home during the event regarding the timelines. Also note that delivery of items will be in mid-November, which leaves plenty of time for holiday shopping!!!



From September 6 through December 6 when customers purchase participating General Mills products, they will receive "school dollar" certificates. Buy 3 GM products and get a certificate worth 2 school dollars, buy 6 GM products and get a certificate worth 4 school dollars, buy 9 and get 6 school dollars. These school dollars add up quickly when everyone works together to save them. McMahon must turn in our school dollar certificates to Hannaford by December 31. There will be a collection box near the front office. Schools receive checks by March 2004. In addition to the money raised through the "school dollar", every Hannaford supermarket will donate a \$1,000 education grant to the registered school in its area which raises the most funds (we won this last year!! Let's try again this year).

L/A Children's Chorus Holding Auditions

L/A Children's Chorus, Central Maine's community choir for children who love to sing, is holding auditions for new members during the months of August, September and October. The chorus is open to all boys and girls from Androscoggin, Oxford, Kennebec, Sagadahoc, Franklin and northern Cumberland Counties from the second through eighth grade. No prior experience or musical training is required. Parents looking for a disciplined, after-school program providing high quality training in music are invited to place their child in the L/A Children's Chorus. Over the years, the young singers have performed with the Portland String Quartet and members of the Portland Symphony Orchestra in concert. Favorable reviews of these performances have appeared three times in the Audience section of the Maine Sunday Telegram. The chorus, which is set to start its eleventh season, also has an active handbell program. Rehearsals are held twice weekly during the early after school hours in the Calvary United Methodist Church of Lewiston. Two major concerts are given each year in the concert hall of the Olin Arts Center at Bates College, Past tours have taken the chorus to the Province of Quebec and Washington, DC.
