This three day seminar is intended for three levels of mental health intervention in disaster: the most immediate responders, usually paraprofessionals; the more long-term intervenors, mental health professionals; and those who supervise both short and long term mental health response. The three days build upon each other, although day two can be taken as a stand-alone unit. Supervisors should attend at least days two and three. In this seminar, participants will learn trauma-informed crisis response, with the ultimate aim of ameliorating--or even preventing--trauma acquisition and loss of functioning. The latest research in the field will be discussed, including topics such as timing of interventions, the advisability of debriefing, and the impact of trauma on special populations, such as children. (21 total Contact Hours, 7 per day)

- The most immediate responders, usually paraprofessionals
- Long-term intervenors, mental health professionals
- Those who supervise both short and long term mental health response
