Our Parents Need Help! Can You Help Them?

My name is Alice and my brother's name is Will. We are teen agers, me a high school senior and my brother a junior. We love our parents and they love us. However we are concerned about them and hope you can help.

They have tried to bring us up in a Christian family based on the values that preach "Love your neighbor" and "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you", respect others, tell the truth and abide by the law.

We are trying to live up to their teachings but are confused by their behavior. They have become more angry, critical of other people and disrespectful of decisions that are made by government. They do not appear to be happy and we observe that their behavior seems to be "Do as we say, not as we do"?

They have been practicing Christians and take us to church every Sunday where we engage in a service that promises that we will go to haven if they routinely practice the basic teachings of our religion. However after church their behavior is quite different.
