

BSA TROOP 2

SCOUT BEHAVIOR CONTRACT

The Boy Scout Law defines behavior that is expected of all scouts. Behavior that is contrary to the Boy Scout Law may be unsafe, may demand a disproportionate and unacceptable supervisory burden by the adult leaders, and is unfair to other Scouts who are trying to get the most benefit from Scout activities. The purpose of the Troop 2 Scout Behavior Contract is to clearly define a consistent set of consequences for unacceptable behavior.

Profanity: The use of profanity is not consistent with the principles of scouting. A scout who uses profanity will not be allowed to continue participating in a Troop 2 activity. Parents will be required to pick up the offending scout at THEIR EXPENSE if deemed necessary by the responsible troop leader.

General misbehavior: Misbehavior or disrespect toward other scouts, parents or adults leaders will not be tolerated. Scout leaders may, at their discretion, issue warnings, remove offending scouts from the activity, or restrict participation in future activities. Parents will be required to pick up the offending scout at THEIR EXPENSE if deemed necessary by the responsible troop leader.

Fighting: Fighting, hitting, or throwing objects at other scouts is forbidden. A scout who engages in any activity will, at a minimum, not be allowed to participate in the troop activity. Parents will be required to pick up the offending scout at THEIR EXPENSE if deemed necessary by the responsible troop leader.
