Lewis Clark Animal Shelter will continue to be there for the litters that show up year after year. You can help us stop the perpetual flow of homeless litters. This Spring, we are beginning a "spay the mom" program. Owners that turn in litters but keep the mom will receive a voucher to return for a FREE spay. This will prevent another surrender of young ones later in the season and the years to come. Got the Dad too? No gender bias here. . . we'll neuter him too.

Want to do your part? Spay or neuter your pet. Willing to give a little extra? Sponsor a surgery for someone who can't afford to spay or neuter their pet. Together we can stop the artesian flow of homeless pets.

Dr. McReynolds Appointed

by the Idaho Board of Veterinary Medicine to serve on Idaho's Euthanasia Task Force. In this position Dr. McReynolds will work with organizations in Idaho to establish humane protocols and procedures aimed at reducing the necessity for euthanasia and providing professional training and record keeping.

Ask ten veterinarians, ten pet owners and ten employees from animal control agencies or humane societies and you will get that many different passionate opinions concerning euthanasia. One thing we all agree on is our goal to end euthanasia.

Lewis Clark Animal Shelter has chosen to spend money, time and skill developing adoption programs, behavior and problem solving classes and outreach programs designed to increase permanent placement of pets in our care so euthanasia isn't necessary. Each of you can help.

When you decide to find a pet, make it your goal to provide a home for a pet that was rescued and is waiting for you to find and love them. Resist the temptation to support the marketing of pets. Adopt from a shelter.

Someone finally came in looking for a companion, preferably younger and smaller than Gumby. . . but Gumby stole their heart and now their home. He sleeps on their bed with them and makes a point of dispelling everyone's attitude about adopting an older pet. His new owner called us and described Gumby as one of the best pet's he's ever had. Apparently he's guite sneaky about slowly sliding into their lap and mimicking a lapdog. Of course no one notices as they visit AROUND his cute boxer head. Pet Health Corner Spring Weather Tips for Healthier, Happier Pets

"Providing food and shelter is not proving love for your pet. Those too, but proper care and protection from harm make the truest sense of responsible pet ownership."

Keep in mind the following tips to help your furry family members stay happy and healthy not only during the Spring months, but throughout the entire year.

- During the Spring LCAS receives entire litters of puppies and kittens. An individual unaltered cat or dog can be responsible for 50 to 200 births a year! Please have you pet spayed or neutered and help reduce pet overpopulation. There aren't enough homes.
- Protect your dog or cat from disease and premature aging by taking them to the veterinarian for an annual exam.
- Warmer weather brings fleas, ticks and mosquitos. Protect your pet with veterinary approved products. Parasites pose serious health hazards for you and your pets. Prevention is the best policy. Talk with your veterinarian before purchasing. There are many worthless products on the market.
- Keep your pet safe by supervising them when outdoors. Walk them on a

leash. Find a safe place for them to run and play off leash with you.

Make sure your pet's collar fits well and has clear identification attached. A microchip is permanent identification that won't fall off, become scratched, faded or modified.

I couldn't get those big brown eyes out of my mind. When I came back he remembered me and wouldn't calm down until I took him out in the yard where he laid down at my feet. Of course I adopted him.

Thank you for not rushing me, Thank you for calling me a few weeks later to see if everything was ok. Thank you for offering the free behavior class, but most of all thank you for my new friend.

streets to fend for himself. Lucky for him, someone cared enough to catch him and bring him to the shelter. We cleaned him up, fed him well and made sure he had plenty of play time. A week passed and still no one called to identify their lost puppy. A quick trip through our clinic for vaccines and surgery then on to behavior classes and Sean's new family couldn't



tell he'd been a 'baby about town' with no health care or grooming. They love him and can't imagine life without him.
