

Mission Statement

To present the consequences of premarital sex and the benefits of abstinence to college-age women and provide them with an opportunity to make a memorable commitment to be sexually pure until marriage.



College-age women are losing their virginity before marriage, causing the spread of sexually transmitted diseases, unplanned pregnancies, unsatisfying marriages, and broken hearts. A study conducted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that 79.5 percent of college students 18 to 24 years of age are sexually active. College women need to know that if they haven't yet made the commitment, it is not too late, and, if a woman has already been sexually active, she can reclaim her purity. College women need to be encouraged, not forgotten.

A women's banquet designed to motivate and encourage college-age women to embrace purity, ultimately giving them a memorable opportunity to solidify this special commitment.



The purpose of the "One Knight Only" banquet is to unite college-age women in an elegant setting and give them the opportunity to hear many speakers share their personal stories and viewpoints on committing to purity before marriage.



Attendees will enjoy different perspectives from some or all of the following: a married couple, a college-age woman, a doctor, and a high-profile public figure.

Attendees will receive a three-course meal catered and served by the event venue as well as musical performances by recording artists or members of the community.
