#### **Big Ted and Gene's Vision**

Two submarines, two cruisers, four destroyers, one frigate, three assault ships, a support ship, 85 aircraft including three F-18 class squadrons, an F-14 squadron, plus assorted helicopters and radar planes, and other aircraft.

And Big Ted.

"Walk softly and carry a Big Stick." President Theodore Roosevelt.

With 5,500 personnel, a four and a half acre flight desk, cruising at upwards of thirty knots, with its above listed battle group CVN 71 the USS Theodore Roosevelt is a big stick.

Gene Roddenberry evidently believed that statement as well. In Wartime and Peacetime.

Yes he knew war. Knew it well. A winner of the Distinguished Flying Cross for almost a hundred combat missions as a WWII bomber pilot, Captain Roddenberry was a great military pilot. However, the 'friendly skies' of the post war world didn't suit him. So he wandered a bit until he found himself a member of the LAPD. Where one's job was to maintain the peace. While carrying a big stick, and a revolver.

Roddenberry's vision of Star Trek was not the wide-eyed idealism some have made it out to be. The ENTERPRISE was armed, they fought battles, killing people and blowing stuff up. But in almost every case, force was the last resort. From the Original Series through Next Generation under Roddenberry, the choice made by those flying the flag of Star Fleet was choose to negotiate rather than fight. But if there was a fight to be had...

"I didn't start this war, but I'm liable to finish it." Kirk 'A Taste of Armageddon'

The various lead characters of all of Roddenberry's series never seemed to go looking for trouble. Even EARTH: Final Conflict and today's ANDROMEDA, they did not go out looking for a fight.

This may be directly related to Roddenberry's war experience. Everybody knew war was coming. He and several friends even joined the Army Air Corp in July of '41 (he had gotten his pilot's license the year before). But the US was still promoting peace until a fateful Sunday Morning in December of that year.

"Yesterday, December 7, 1941, a date which will live in infamy, the United States of America was suddenly and deliberately attacked by naval and air forces of the Empire of Japan." -FDR

America and her people have been, through MOST of our history... yeah... Most of our history... have not gone around looking for a fight. There have been instances where 'pre-emptive action' was called for to avoid a more serious situation later. But for the majority of the USA's 225 years, the country did not react in force unless first attacked.

Japanese Imperial Admiral Yamamoto predicted that his country would essentially have the run of the Pacific for about six months after they attacked Pearl Harbor. But then they would ultimately suffer defeat.

"We have awakened a sleeping giant and have instilled in him a terrible resolve"

He knew America well, he had been over here as military attache, he had seen the people and the industrial might of the country. He had counseled the Emperor against open warfare. But ordered to plan and lead the attack, he did.

Historically those that have challenged America have always underestimated our willingness to do what was required to restore our country to peace.

Maybe in this case those that ordered and planned the Attack of September eleventh have been watching the TV talk shows. Listening to the people that get on Jerry Springer and watching the commercials that show American men as stumbling idiots and American women as hopeless shop-aholics.

Perhaps they have read in the papers about how Americans are all worried about irradiated meat in the supermarkets or whether or not a student led prayer at a sporting event was to be allowed. Americans are more concerned about saving the three-toed toad than defending themselves. Citizens of the USA wring their hands about who was being voted off 'Survivor' and weren't worried about a few irrational glory-seeking Islamic extremists.

In that moment. Broadcast world-wide on TV.

America. That sleeping giant of 1941.

Was reawakened.

Years before, men like the writer Gene Roddenberry, a bright-eyed man from Boston named John F. Kennedy, Strom Thurmond, an army colonel at the time, an actor by the name of Ronald Reagan, Theodore Roosevelt Jr., and innumerable others joined the fight against evil.

Roddenberry's dream of a brighter future did not go down on a hijacked airliner, or in the fires of the collapsing buildings they struck.

No it didn't.

If anything, it was made even stronger.

Yes, we are looking forward to a better future, to that great adventure. People like the cowards who send others to die while promising them the first seat in heaven will not get in the way of that dream. They will not kill it. They will not stop it. That sleeping giant that they have slapped awake will see to that. And Big Ted and his friends is just one of the Big Sticks the Giant is carrying.

Every week, no matter what happened the week before, every episode of Roddenberry's first look at that future began with the same idealistic, hopeful speech. During the episode, somebody might die, a madman might try to hijack a starship, an evil menace would raise its head to challenge them, but by the end of the hour, they returned to that vision, that goal.

Real life is not as simple as a 'one hour morality play'. But it can be a model for life.

Evil has reared up in our face, madmen have struck, people have died. We must defeat it. Defeat them. Then and only then, however long it takes, can we return to that vision and pursue that goal.

- ...to seek out new life and new civilizations
- ...to boldly go where no man has gone before."

#### **MAJOR SCAMS:**

On September 11<sup>th</sup> this country experienced a horrific tragedy when we witnessed two commercial planes crash into the World Trade Towers. With great sorrow, I pray that those that were affected can find the strength to continue the American way of life. As I thought of the pain, I could never conceive what would happen next. I found the scum of the earth taking advantage of the Internet and email to propagate the fear of terrorism. Be smart by staying informed. These scams are 100% false.

- SCAM 1: An email from a woman who claims that a friend of a friend had an Afghani boyfriend who disappeared shortly before the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. She received a letter from him on September 10 begging her not to fly on any commercial airliners on September 11th and to stay away from shopping malls on Halloween, October 31st.
- SCAM 2: Do Not Open Blue Envelopes in your U.S. Mail ONCE YOU HAVE READ THIS PLEASE FORWARD TO ALL YOU KNOW. This is from Schwab corporate headquarters-so it's no joke. Very scary. Be careful Just when you thought you were safe, now we have the following to deal with...please read, it definitely is a serious threat to our lives and health. This is an alert about a virus in the original sense of the word...one that affects your body, not your hard drive. There have been 23 confirmed cases of people attacked by the Kingerman Virus, a virus that arrives in your real mailbox, not your e-mail box.

#### ATA-100 RAID

As computer users add more hard drive space to their systems and collect numerous pictures, music or data files. It has become harder to maintain and duplicate these files for safekeeping due to the massive size. In the past many users found they could inexpensively backup selective important information by using floppy disc, DAC tape backup, Zip drives, optical drives, compact disc and DVD writer systems. But these systems were never able to fully backup system file in order to fully restore a home computer without rebuilding the operating system. Recently a new, inexpensive product has come onto the market that will do just that for the home user. The ATA-100 PCI RAID card can provide superior means to backup data without the lost of a single data cluster. RAID stands for Redundant Array of Independent.

RAID technology is not exactly new to the computer industry, as SCSI RAID systems first came out in the early 80's allowing the first backup capability for a very expensive price tag. Most SCSI RAID systems run around \$4,000 to \$5,000 which included three (3) 10 gigabyte SCSI hard drives within a hot swappable bay and a controller card. These systems gave excellent capability for those the could afford the price range with was out of reach of the average home user.

A RAID system functions by stripping or duplicating bits of data clusters from one hard drive to one of the other hard drives within the unit. When a hard drive dies, the user would pull the bad drive and replace with another. In many cases the system senses the new drive and begins to rebuild the new to original state without shutting down the system. Sound pretty simple but exactly when such a system demands certified matched drives. This made SCSI RAID systems very expensive to maintain because the operator would be forced to keep spare drives on the shelf or replaced all the drives with newer technology.

So what makes ATA-100 RAID a vast improvement over its big brother SCSI RAID? For starters the controller card and swab bay cost are a quarter the price of SCSI. Secondly, the ATA-100 hard drive cost is much lower, while giving almost the same performance as the SCSI. Third, the ATA-100 drive does not need to be even matched or even the same size in order to make stripping or RAID to function. Lastly, ATA-100 RAID can be setup in a manner to make all installed hard drives appear as one drive within the operating system. Overall a 120-gigabyte ATA-100 RAID system will cost the average home user around \$500 - \$750 to provide the best, reliable, and efficient backup system.

I found a few companies that provide this product a varying prices and capabilities as a stand-alone PCI Card or installed on the motherboard.
