PROJECT OBJECTIVE:

To expose students to ground breaking, contemporary plays and their creators.

A) <u>Performance Component</u> Solo or Group work (worth 65%)

Solo = 5-10 minute presentation

2 people = 10-15 minute presentation

- 1) Introduce your play and its creators. (worth 5%)
- 2) Briefly tell us what was happening the year your show opened.
 Use a visual aid to help you do this.
 Involve the class with some type of interactive activity (worth 10%)
- 3) Present a well-rehearsed scene or monologue in the style of the original production. Focus on the acting *style*. (worth 50%)

You do not **have** to memorize lines, but the actor can only do so much with a book in their hand. A book in hand will reduce your grade but not destroy it. The highest score you can earn for an unmemorized scene is a "C."

B) Written Component Individual work (worth 35%)

Paragraph #1: Introduce your play and its creators. (1 sentence) Using your own words, **briefly** summarize the play. (3-6 sentences)

Paragraph #2: Tell me how and the play broke new theatrical ground. (3-5 sentences) How did this play make an impact on the theatrical world? (3-5 sentences) Is this play still important? (3-5 sentences)
