

Meeting was called to order by President Marvin Stokes. All officers were present. Orientation at 6PM was attended by 5 guests. The Agenda was approved as published. Introduction of the guests was followed by introduction of members in attendance. A motion to approve the minutes as published in the Newsletter was made by Bill Ellis, seconded by Lois Shannon; motion carried.

#### OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary Trish Bridewell read a thank you note from Patsy Rains, and announced that Tammy Hodgkins had prepared a new roster available to members. (Please shred your old rosters before discarding)

Treasurer Salley Hobbling report for month ending 6/30/06 shows a beginning bank balance on 5/31/06 of \$9337.31, with income of \$625.14, expenses of \$639.54, leaving a bank balance on 6/30/06 of \$9322.91. She also submitted her report for the quarter ending 6/30/06, report for fiscal year ending 6/30/06, annual financial report June 2006, YRE participation report 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter ending 6/30/06, and GNFTS #2 and #3. These reports are available from the Treasurer.

Vice President Bill Ellis indicated that he had contacted all YRE POCs by late June and all YRE boxes are current and up to date.

President Marvin Stokes reported that his presentation to the Daytona Beach Rotary Club this morning was well received and he had positive response, as well as requests for further information, pamphlets, etc. Under his Regional Director hat, he also reported that the IVV had approved 5K routes on YRE walks offered on a 10K route in order to obtain sanctions. As participants age it is important to include those who cannot or do not wish to do 10K routes; it will now be "legal" doing a short route. He asked that all POCs look around their area and map out a 5K in conjunction with the current 10K route Pat Hodgkins found a source for brochure holders; need authorization to spend the funds to purchase them. Motion was made and seconded to purchase 25 of these holders for displaying our advertising, not to exceed \$60; motion carried.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

HW Workshop, Saturday, August 12 at Volusia Memorial 9AM to Noon. This is when we make plans for the year and we encourage any and all to attend this meeting and bring ideas concerning new walks, new activities, and/or anything you would like to see the Club do or participate in. We are still doing our charitable endeavors such as our \$600 contribution to the DBCC scholarship fund; have a letter from DBCC asking if we plan to contribute for Spring 2007 semester All officers, chairpersons, and committee chairmen are urged to attend; however, this meeting is open to everyone and we hope for a large turnout and many ideas.

Port Orange Trust Community (POCT) Building The Happy Wanderers donated \$1000 to the POCT to help in the construction of the building. This minimum amount was to get our name on a plaque, recognition in their brochures, use of meeting rooms and restrooms in the building. After the 2004 hurricanes, the City of Port Orange met with the POTC and together they modified the building so that it could be used as an emergency shelter and facility to feed folks. This modified architectural design of the building cut out the meeting rooms, which were replaced with a large kitchen. There will be a large banquet hall seating more than 100 persons available for rent; this would be cost prohibitive for us to use, nor do we need such space.

<u>Event Coordinators</u> Urgently needed. Next year we will host 6-8 events Marvin indicated that he is very busy with both the Happy Wanderers Club and the SouthEast Regional Director duties and he needs and would appreciate your help very much. An Event Coordinator takes a little effort in the coordination and a bit more in time, and he asks everyone to please think about doing your part. He should not be doing all of the event coordinating himself. Events will be announced at the workshop.

Nominating Committee Please contact Marvin if you are interested in running for office and/or serving on the Committee. The Committee must submit a slate of officers by March 2007; election is in May 2007 with an assumption of office in July 2007.

#### **WALKEXPLANATIONS**

Sunday Walks are sanctioned 10k (6.2 mi.) Year-Round events and you can receive credit so bring your books. You may receive Event credit only twice during the year (Jan-Jun and Jul-Dec). You may receive distance credit each time the Event is walked. \$3.00 per walker.

"Funwalks" are non-sanctioned 5k (3.1 mi) walks. We walk for one hour, mostly in groups, and at the end we meet at a local restaurant for a snack or whatever! It's a wonderful way to keep ourselves walking and keep up with the many friendships we have formed. It's a "no hassle", no "set up", no "work", mid-week walk. "Funwalks are free to everyone".

"Worker's Walk" is a special time for <u>workers</u> who may not have time to walk on the day of the event. It's also a time to make sure that the route is correct, well-written and understood by everyone.

"Monthly Event" is a sanctioned Event hosted by the Happy Wanderers on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of most months. It's a time when walkers from other clubs come to walk/bike the "Event of the Month". Events are usually held in parks, towns, ANY interesting place that someone suggests. \$3 Registration Fee for ALL, credit and non-credit walkers. Children 12 and under walk FREE unless for IVV credit.

<u>DIRECTIONS TO WALKS</u> PAGE 6

- AIRPORT ROAD PLAYGROUND: I-95 Exit 256. Turn west onto Taylor Rd (Hwy 421). Drive about a 1/4 mile to traffic signal at Taylor and Williamson (Airport Rd). Turn left and follow Airport Rd for approximately 3.5 Miles. Just past the Fire Station, turn left onto the park road and drive a short distance to the parking lot.
- <u>DAYTONA BEACH SHORES:</u> I-95 Exit 256. Drive east on Hwy 421 (Dunlawton Ave) approximately 5 miles to S. Atlantic Ave. Turn Left onto S.Alantic and drive\_pproximately 2.3 miles to Rendon County Park on your right.
- DAYTONA COLIN'S PARK:

  I-95 Exit 261 US92 International Speedway Blvd. Drive east on ISB approx. 4.6 miles to Ridgewood Ave. (US Hwy 1). Turn left onto Ridgewood and drive approx. 1.2 miles to Mason Ave. Turn right onto Mason Ave. And drive approx. 1 mile (crossing the Halifax River on the Seabreeze Bridge) to N. Halifax, Turn left onto N. Halifax and drive approx. 0.6 mile to traffic signal at University Blvd. Turn left onto University Blvd and drive One-half block to Colin's Park on your left.
- DAYTONA HALIFAX MARINA: 1-95 Exit 261 US92 International Speedway Blvd. Drive east on ISB to Beach St. Turn right onto Beach and continue to traffic signal at Basin St. Turn left onto Basin St, follow Basin about 2 tenths of a mile And turn right into parking lot near West Marine store and Stock Exchange restaurant.
- DELAND YR (LIBRARY): I-4 Exit 118. Continue on Hwy 44 for 4.3 miles to Amelia Ave. Turn left on Amelia Ave (traffic signal at Hwy 44 & Amelia). Drive one block to Howry. Turn right and drive 2 blocks to Library on your left.
- NEW SMYRNA YRE (PUBLIX): I-95 Exit 249, drive east on SR44 for 5.8 miles. Just past the Sun Trust Bank turn right into the Shopping Center and drive to the Publix Supermarket.
- ORMOND BEACH LIBRARY YRE: I-95 Exit 268 SR40 (Granada Blvd) Go east, crossing US1, to S. Beach St. Turn right onto Beach St, drive One block to Corbin St. (just past the library). Turn right onto Corbin, drive one-half block and turn Right into parking lot.
- ORMOND BEACH NOVA PARK: I-95 Exit 268 SR40 (Granada Blvd). Drive east approx. 2.7 miles to Nova Road. Turn left onto Nova and drive approx. ½ mile to traffic signal at Main Trail. Turn left onto Main Trail and, almost immediately, turn right into parking lot for Nova Park.
- PALM COAST PUBLIX: I-95 Exit 289, Palm Coast Pkwy. Drive east on Palm Coast Pkwy approx. 6 tenths of a mile to Florida Park Dr. Turn left onto Florida Park Dr and drive to entrance of Palm Harbor Shopping Center (approx. 1 tenth of a mile). Turn left into shopping center and park in front of Publix.
- PONCE INLET WINTER HAVEN: 1-95 Exit 256, Dunlawton Ave (SR421). Drive east on Dunlawton, crossing the Chappell Bridge to S. Atlantic Ave. Turn right onto S. Atlantic and drive approx. 4 miles to Winter Haven Park on your left.
- PORT ORANGE LIBRAY: From I-95, take Exit 256 onto Hiway 421 (Taylor Rd), drive east on Hiway 421 to traffic signal at Clyde Morris Blvd...approx 8/10 of a mile. Turn left onto Clyde Morris and drive to City Center Blvd...approx 6/10 of a mile. Turn right onto City Center Blvd, drive to City Center Circle and turn right...about 2/10 of a mile. Drive just about 1/10 of a mile and turn right into Library Parking lot.

Turn left onto Clyde Morris and drive approx 2 miles to Food Lion Shopping Center. Turn left into parking lot before reaching Madeline Ave and park in southeast corner of lot.

Labor Day is a national legal holiday that is over 100 years old. Over the years, it has evolved from a purely labor union celebration into a general "last fling of summer" festival. It grew out of a celebration and parade in honor of the working class by the Knights of Labor in 1882 in New York. In 1884, the Knights held a large parade in New York City celebrating the working class. The parade was held on the first Monday in September. The Knights passed a resolution to hold all future parades on the same day, designated by them as Labor Day. The Socialist Party held a similar celebration of the working class on May 1 This date eventually became known as May Day, and was celebrated by Socialists and Communists in commemoration of the working man. In the U.S., the first Monday in September was selected to reject any identification with Communism. In the late 1880's, labor organizations began to lobby various state legislatures for recognition of Labor Day as an official state holiday. The first states to declare it a state holiday in, 1887, were Oregon, Colorado, New York, Massachusetts, and New Jersey. Then in 1894, Congress passed a law recognizing Labor Day as an official national holiday. Today, Labor Day is observed not only in the U.S. but also in Canada, and in other industrialized nations. While it is a general holiday in the United States, its roots in the working class remain clearer in European countries.


