

MINUTES OF THE HAPPY WANDERERS BI-MONTHLY MEETING Thursday, September 14, 2006

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by President Marvin Stokes. The agenda for the meeting was approved. Marvin issued a special welcome to 2 guests; 18 HW members introduced themselves. Marvin especially welcomed back Sandy Dennis who is recovering from hip replacement and is doing well. A call for the approval of the minutes of the July 13 meeting included a correction the Christmas Party is <u>Thursday</u>, <u>December 14</u>, 2006; minutes were approved as corrected.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Secretary had no report.

Treasurer's report: August balance of \$9717.50, receipts of \$2919.02, disbursements of \$2322.22, cash flow of \$596.80, with an ending balance of \$10,314.30. Marvin indicated that a large portion of our income came as a result of dissolution of the Patrick Pacers club; a letter from Joe Aycock indicates that the Club's remaining funds were evenly distributed to the FVA, Mid-Florida Milers, and The Happy Wanderers. A check for \$2507.69 was our share of this distribution. One of our disbursements, \$600, was sent to 2 Katrina clubs who were wiped out to help them get back on their feet, and \$100 to the Port Orange Presbyterian Church where we hold our meetings and who do not charge us a fee for the room; this for them to use as they see fit.

Our event in Princess Place on August 19 had a total income of \$178.50, expenses of \$131.25, leaving a gain of \$47.25. There were 26 participants. Leftover food items were frozen and will be used at our Pierson event. Lois Shannon thanked everyone for their help at Princess Place.

Our Walk Across Florida #17 event in Inverness and Floral City will be discussed later.

Vice-President was absent.

<u>President's report: Marvin thanked everyone for their continuing great support and efforts to the Club. He will be attending the National Executive Council Seattle, WA meeting as SE Regional Director in September. Jim Leitch will be accompanying him and they will travel via Juneau, AK as Marvin wants to obtain his 49th State/38th Capital stamp. Contact Marvin should you have anything you would like him to present to the Council.</u>

OLD BUSINESS:

A <u>Brochure Holders Purchase</u> 50 holders have been purchased and are ready for distribution to advertise our Club and what we do. If you know of places where these can be displayed, let Marvin know and he will get them to you. Lois suggested that we label the holders with The Happy Wanderers logo and this will be done.

B. Walkers and 18 bikers, and a wonderful lunch by Rena McMahon. Saturday night 65 folks enjoyed dinner at Stumpknockers. On Sunday, sponsored by the Suncoast Sandpipers, there were 99 walkers and 21 'swimmers' and a delicious fish fry at Crystal River sponsored by the Crystal River Nature Coast Volksmarch, Hiking & Biking Club. On Monday, The Happy Wanderers sponsored the Floral City walk, where 79 walkers enjoyed a very nice walk, especially the Avenue of Oaks. Lois thanked all the volunteers for their work throughout the weekend.

C. <u>T-Shirt Progress</u> We are planning to obtain new Club T-shirts and polo shirts. Marvin asked for input regarding the polo shirts as they are not inexpensive. Linda Ellis has found a place that will take a small order and mix/match as long as we supply the art work. Men's T-shirts with small Club logo and Women's Scoop Neck T-shirts with large logo will be available for \$12 each. The polo shirts, with a small Club logo on the front, will be \$22 each; a little expensive but they are good quality. Color was discussed; almost any color is available except teal. A dark color shirt will have a white logo and a light color shirt will have a black logo. Pat Hodgkins asked if we could secure a catalog of colors to assist in the selection; Marvin will obtain this. Question of feasibility of considering polo shirts was put forth and was accepted by the members in attendance.

WALKEXPLANATIONS

Sunday Walks are sanctioned 10k (6.2 mi.) Year-Round events and you can receive credit so bring your books. You may receive Event credit only twice during the year (Jan-Jun and Jul-Dec). You may receive distance credit each time the Event is walked. \$3.00 per walker.

[&]quot;Funwalks" are non-sanctioned 5k (3.1 mi) walks. We walk for one hour, mostly in groups, and at the end we meet at a local restaurant for a snack or whatever! It's a wonderful way to keep ourselves walking and keep up with the many friendships we have formed. It's a "no hassle", no "set up", no "work", mid-week walk. "Funwalks are free to everyone".

[&]quot;Worker's Walk" is a special time for <u>workers</u> who may not have time to walk on the day of the event. It's also a time to make sure that the route is correct, well-written and understood by everyone.

[&]quot;Monthly Event" is a sanctioned Event hosted by the Happy Wanderers on the 4th Saturday of most months. It's a time when walkers from other clubs come to walk/bike the "Event of the Month". Events are usually held in parks, towns, ANY interesting place that someone suggests. \$3 Registration Fee for ALL, credit and non-credit walkers. Children 12 and under walk FREE unless for IVV credit.

WALK DIRECTIONS IN ORDER OF CALENDAR OF EVENTS

- PORT ORANGE LIBRAY: From I-95, take Exit 256 onto Hiway 421 (Taylor Rd), drive east on Hiway 421 to traffic signal at Clyde Morris Blvd...approx 8/10 of a mile. Turn left onto Clyde Morris and drive to City Center Blvd...approx 6/10 of a mile. Turn right onto City Center Blvd, drive to City Center Circle and turn right...about 2/10 of a mile. Drive just about 1/10 of a mile and turn right into Library Parking lot.
- NEW SMYRNA YRE (PUBLIX): 1-95 Exit 249, drive east on SR44 for 5.8 miles. Just past the Sun Trust Bank turn right into the Shopping Center and drive to the Publix Supermarket.
- ORMOND BEACH CASSEN PARK: I-95 Exit 268 SR40 (Granada Blvd). Drive east, crossing US1, to S. Beach St. Turn right onto Beach, Drive one-half block to entrance to Cassen Park on your left. Turn left into parking lot.
- PALM COAST PUBLIX: I-95 Exit 289, Palm Coast Pkwy. Drive east on Palm Coast Pkwy approx. 6 tenths of a mile to Florida Park Dr. Turn left onto Florida Park Dr and drive to entrance of Palm Harbor Shopping Center (approx. 1 tenth of a mile). Turn left into shopping center and park in front of Publix.
- <u>DAYTONA BEACH SHORES:</u> I-95 Exit 256. Drive east on Hwy 421 (Dunlawton Ave) approximately 5 miles to S. Atlantic Ave. Turn Left onto S.Alantic and drive_pproximately 2.3 miles to Rendon County Park on your right.
- VOLUSIA MALL: From I-95, take Exit 261, Hiway 92 (ISB) and drive east on Hiway 92 to traffic signal at Midway Ave...approx 2 miles. Turn left onto Midway and drive into the Volusia Mall Parking lot. Bear to the right and go to Main Mall Entrance.
- ORMOND BEACH NOVA PARK: I-95 Exit 268 SR40 (Granada Blvd). Drive east approx. 2.7 miles to Nova Road. Turn left onto Nova and drive approx. ½ mile to traffic signal at Main Trail. Turn left onto Main Trail and, almost immediately, turn right into parking lot for Nova Park.
- PORT ORANGE YMCA: I-95, Exit 256, Dunlawton Ave (SR421). Drive east on Dunlawton to 4* traffic signal at City Center Pkwy. Turn left onto City Center Pkwy and drive approx. 1/2 mile to entrance to YMCA parking lot on your right. Turn right into the parking lot.
- PORT ORANGE CAUSEWAY: I-95, Exit 256, Dunlawton Ave (SR421). Drive east on Dunlawton, crossing Ridgewood Ave to Seabird Island (street just before reaching the bridge.). Turn right and then immediately left headed toward the River under the bridge. Park near the gazebo.
- PORT ORANGE PRESBYTERIAN: I-95, Exit 256, Dunlawton Ave (5R421). Drive east on Dunlawton for 8/10 of a mile to Clyde Morris Blvd. Turn left onto Clyde Morris and drive 7/10 of a mile to Church at 4662 Clyde Morris on your left.
- DAYTONA CITY ISLAND: I-95 Exit 261 US92 International Speedway Blvd. Go east on ISB to Beach St. Turn right onto Beach to Magnolia Ave, turn left and cross the small bridge to end of street. Park in lot to your le
- HOLLY HILL 11 HST PARK: From I-95 take Exit 265 onto LPGA Blvd. Drive east on LPGA Blvd 4.2 miles to end of LPGA at Riverside Dr. Cross Riverside Drive and enter parking lot for 11th Street Park.
- INDIATLANTIC: Blueberry Muffin Restaurant 1103 North Highway A1A. From I-95 take exit #180 east on US 192. Drive to hiway A1A about 8.6 miles. Turn left onto A1A and drive north on A1A for about 8 tenths of a mile to Blueberry Muffin which will be on your left.
- SOUTH DAYTONA BALLPARK: 1-95, Exit 256, Dunlawton Ave (SR421). Drive east on Dunlawton to Nova Rd. Turn left onto Nova Rd and Drive to Big Tree Rd. Turn right onto Big Tree, go 1/2 block to entrance to Big Tree Ballfield. Turn left into Parking lot.
- PONCE INLET WINTER HAVEN: I-95 Exit 256, Dunlawton Ave (SR421). Drive east on Dunlawton, crossing the Chappell Bridge to S. Atlantic Ave. Turn right onto S. Atlantic and drive approx. 4 miles to Winter Haven Park on your left.
- ORMOND BEACH LIBRARY YRE: I-95 Exit 268 SR40 (Granada Blvd) Go east, crossing US1, to S. Beach St. Turn right onto Beach St, drive One block to Corbin St. (just past the library). Turn right onto Corbin, drive one-half block and turn Right into parking lot.
- DAYTONA HALIFAX MARINA: 1-95 Exit 261 US92 International Speedway Blvd. Drive east on ISB to Beach St. Turn right onto Beach and continue to traffic signal at Basin St. Turn left onto Basin St, follow Basin about 2 tenths of a mile And turn right into parking lot near West Marine store and Stock Exchange restaurant
- MT DORA: From I-4 take Exit 101C (SR46) and drive west to North Highland St in Mt Dora (approx 18.7 miles). Turn Right onto N. Highland St, and drive 4 blocks to E. 5th Ave. Turn left onto E. 5th Ave. and drive approx 0.5 Miles to Donnelly St. Turn left onto Donnelly St. and drive 2 blocks to Third Ave. Turn right onto Third Ave And Sunshine Mountain_bakery will be on your right about one block down Third Ave.



A LITTLE HISTORY...

The small town of Pierson, in the northwest corner of Volusia County with population of about 2650, is named for three Pierson brothers and two Pierson cousins, all natives of Sweden, who came down the St. Johns River in the 1870s from their homes in Connecticut and homesteaded in the area. The rail depot was originally called Piersonville by the railroad, but the name was later shortened to Pierson. When the good news of the hospitable climate of Central Florida reached the friends and neighbors in Sweden, more families arrived. Not surprisingly, the families were Lutherans and the Ebenezer Lutheran Church was founded in 1884. Many of the early families are buried in the church cemetery which is on the walk route, and many of their ancestors still live in Pierson.

Citrus crops constituted the early economy of the region but the severe freezes of 1894-1895 destroyed the trees (Henry DeLand's groves were also destroyed at this time). A few subsisted with the production of turpentine, but another Pierson was growing ferns in Connecticut and he suggested trying ferns to substitute for the citrus groves. Thus was born the beginning of the ornamental fern production which now engages hundreds of acres and hundreds of people. (Henry DeLand left the area. DeLand Academy, which he founded, was renamed after John B. Stetson who became a major benefactor, along with Henry Flagler and several others, to perpetuate the educational goals of the school.)

Pierson is the home of Chipper Jones, third baseman for the Atlanta Braves. Pierson is also the home of the only nudist resort in Volusia County.



OUR HAPPY BEGINNINGS...

The Happy Wanderers originated as the Pierson Happy Wanderers when we were granted a charter on July 10th, 1991 as member number 717 of the American Volkssport Association (AVA). The club was begun by Joe Sexton with a few friends and relatives and the first walk was conducted during the weekend of October 26 and 27, 1991. The 11 km route started in the yard of a private residence in the unincorporated community of Emporia, about a mile south of Pierson, and extended along country roads and through the ferneries. The award was a suspended medal with a leaf of the leatherleaf fern, one of several ornamental ferns being grown in the area. The club planned for a series of medals with each one depicting a different fern from the area.






