modes, and the scenario. I recently attended an electrical safety course sponsored by BGMU and Kentucky 811 (call before you dig). The course discussed the importance of safety when installing items around the house such as antennas and towers. One element of the discussion was to get people to remember to keep antennas and towers clear of power lines and other utilities. BGMU demonstrated an antenna falling on a power line with their safety trailer. Kentucky 811 is a service that will come to your site and mark utilities free of charge. This keeps the ham from having to pay the cost of repairing services if they damage them while installing equipment.
