#### PRESIDENT Timothy Robinson KF4MGU COMMENTS

September is National Emergency Preparedness Month. It's a good time to consider your personal emergency plans and to organize what you and your family would do if an incident took place. Guidelines for planning can be obtained on the FEMA website or through an emergency management office.

President Bush has declared a different theme for each week of September. The 1<sup>st</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> is Back-to-School, the 9<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> is Business Preparedness, the 16<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> is Multicultural Preparedness, and the 23<sup>rd</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> Home and Family Preparedness. Information about the program can be found at the website www.ready.gov/.



I encourage any ham who is intereseted in volunteering in emergency communications to complete some kind of NIMS training. Public safety agencies have to be totally NIMS compliant by the

end of this November. This means they have to complete the courses specified by the federal government or they will no longer be able to receive federal funding such as grants. Some agencies are requiring its employees and volunteers alike to be compliant so there won't be any question about elegibility in the future. The basic NIMS courses are simple to complete and are available online through FEMA at no charge. The first course to start with is IS-700 NIMS: An Introduction. If you want to go further other suggested courses are IS-100 Introduction to the Incident Command System, IS-200 ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents, and IS-800 NRP: An Introduction.



The September meeting will be held on the 21<sup>st</sup> at Covington Woods Park. This meeting is the annual picnic and tailgating that we have each year. The tailgating will begin around 5:00 and be followed by dinner at

6:30. Come out and enjoy the fellowship and company of our club members. If you can, bring a friend and introduce them to our ham community. Please bring your ham gear to swap or sell.

I read several magazines each month to keep up with current events as they pertain to my job. In the August/September issue of Advanced Rescue Technology, James Careless, talks about the untapped resources waiting to be discovered in ham operators. Careless suggests that public safety agencies should seek out hams and see what they can provide. Careless details how hams can give agencies an interoperable link when there is no other way for them to communicate. Hams are a vital asset to the community.
