

Hello Everyone.

December is a month that holds significant importance for Christians around the world, primarily due to the celebration of Christmas, which commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ. This event is central to our Christian faith, symbolizing hope, love, and redemption. In the Gospel of Luke 2:10-11 the angel announces to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." This proclamation highlights the joy and hope that the birth of Christ brings to humanity, emphasizing the Christian value of joy in the face of adversity.

As we celebrate Christmas, we believers are reminded to carry this hope into the new year, sharing it with others and embodying the values of joy, love, and community that December represents.


Month of December: Selfie Elfie
