

Minutes from August 24, 2008 Board of Directors Meeting

35 Audience

Directors present: Robert DeMayo, Glen Fredericks, Julie Dickson, Steve Mentzer,

Bob Baker, Phil Appleton, John Jensen, Merrick Teague, Ray Grace.

Call to Order: 10:04 am by Rob DeMayo

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Julie reported receiving 14 mailed in ballots to date, and provided ballots for Ralph's locked ballot box for those who cannot vote in person on Aug 31st.

Motion to accept report as distributed [Julie], 2nd [Glen], carried

Treasurer's Report: Motion to accept as distributed [Steve], 2nd [Julie], carried.

Committee Reports:

Activities- Phil reported that for Labor Day wkend: kid's crafts 10am pavilion; Ice Cream Sundaes 2pm at the beach; and the Talent Show 7pm pavilion. Phil thanked all volunteers that helped with activities this year. The audience showed appreciation to Phil in the form of applause. Buildings/Maintenance- John reported that Webber fuel can provide propane at \$2.80 gal for approx 2500 gal or until April 09. [up from last yr at \$2.15 gal] Last yr the lodge used 1200 gal, pavilion used 825 gal and the pump house used 73 gal. John noted the motion sensor light at the gate has issues, and will be fixed soon. John asked about blood in the pavilion men's room Sat pm. A member replied that a boy had a nose bleed. Finance/Bylaws- Bob reported that the revised site rules are being retyped, and he apologized for the delay.

Newsletter- Julie asked for final submissions to the BUZZ by midnight Sunday pm, and noted that this meeting and BUZZ issue will be her last. The audience showed appreciation with applause. Julie thanked all those contributing information to the BUZZ, and stated that the August BUZZ will be out prior to the election. Election results will be posted at the gate and on the website.

Roads/Grounds- Merrick reported due to rain that he continuously re-grades roads, due to damage/washouts. He expects to work on Boulder Hill this afternoon. Merrick thanked John Colella and John Casali for filling pot holes.

<u>Safety</u>- Ray reported the security guard is doing well, even if some don't like him. Many rules are being enforced. Ray noted that violation letters have been sent out.

<u>Site Control</u>- Rob reported 7 permits: A96-97 stones; A98 stones; CCW5 Shed; CCV47 3 trees; A62 Shingle shed; CCE5-6 level lot and stone; A95 Measure lot. Rob noted a tree identified by Marron's is considered safe until the winter tree cutting. If anyone has dead trees for cutting, contact Rob.

<u>Water/Sewer</u>- Bob stated that water was tested on Aug 15th, showing no sign of coliform bacteria, no nitrates/nitrites and was declared safe. A magnetic starter failed at the pump-house and was replaced. Horseshoe pit septic tank work is pending.

Motion to open to the floor [Julie], 2nd [Glen], carried.

A87 Denise Whicher: announcement re: ramp, tabled to unfinished business.

A73 Ron Mazzola: Asked whether Webber's was coming to talk to campers prior to the end of the season. John wasn't sure the rep would have time, will ask if there is interest.

A73 Ron Mazzola: question for Merrick- rocks placed along road to leach field with culvert send water to the culvert. Ron asked whether the road can be prevented from washing into the culvert. Merrick stated he is using this rock and culvert solution in several areas.

A09 Ralph Cataldo: Noted that some stairs from pavilion to restrooms are rotted and in need of replacement. He also asked about the ramp, tabled to agenda item.

A09 Ralph Cataldo: Asked about water tower [tank]. Bob replied it is on hold, pending a more comprehensive solution.

A104 <u>Larry Fitzpatrick</u>: Asked about a contract for water with Tom Canfield's brother. He was told that while we do have a \$400 contract for septic maintenance with Tom, we have nothing with the brother. Rob added that we use Rick Huppe [Anything Water] for water needs. Directors noted that he is not under contract, but is on-call, as the established, licensed water consult.

A24 <u>Jim Goodberry</u>: declared BINGO as a success, and they will continue through Sept. Jim added that adult game nights Tues-Thurs will continue into September as well.

B190 <u>Mike Feola</u>: started a committee with which to raise funds for a light pole at the beach fishing area. Needs to be a PSNH pole, cost \$700. Mike expects to raise half and asked the board to supplement the funds needed. A motion was made and withdrawn to install a pole. Another motion was made to appropriate funds, but was withdrawn; tabled to new business.

A13 <u>Bill Wilson</u>: Asked about propane at the pavilion, whether a heater would be installed to replace the water heater. Merrick replied that due to no outside wall, tankless heaters cannot be used. Instead, a small boiler to provide heat and hot water was proposed, being researched now. He noted that propane costs would be cut in half.

A13 <u>Bill Wilson</u>: noted no mention of shower meter money. John replied that coin boxes were removed last yr, since replacing them was not cost-effective, that push buttons allowing water shutoff was in effect, after vandals left water on in bathrooms.

A13 <u>Bill Wilson</u>: asked about hill below Charley Scott's -needing a culvert along side for drainage. Merrick replied with his plan for culvert lined with large rocks for drainage.

A13 <u>Bill Wilson</u>: asked for clarification on Horseshoe Pit Tank mentioned. Rob replied it is an electrical box, with breaker hanging. Additional information provided by Charley- the pump was shutting off/on, not allowing pumping. The two 1 ½ horse pumps are now set to shut off simultaneously to allow the two 2 horse pumps at the pump house to operate. The switch at the pit is to be rewired.

A98 <u>Jim Roby</u>: stated the reason why 75 gal water tank is at pavilion, that there were two at the lodge, and one was moved to the pavilion years ago to avoid the cost of a new tank.

A73 Ron Mazzola: Asked about the distance from the lake required for a light pole. Directors estimated 250 ft, especially if creosote.

A13 <u>Bill Wilson</u>: asked whether trimming tree branches would open the area to prevent needing to install additional lighting. Merrick stated justification as more light, less vandalism/less kids hanging out at the beach at night.

A78 <u>Elaine Baccardax</u>: asked why no fines appear on the treasurer's report. Steve replied that fines are levied, and will not appear as income until collected. Steve clarified that fines would appear on statements, once levied, but show as arrears until paid.

Motion to bring back [Julie], 2nd [Merrick], carried.

Unfinished Business:

Arrears Report- Steve stated 8 sites are in arrears over \$500, over 150 days, approx \$20,700 total. He added that the Sheriff's sale on site CCV28 will be held on Sept 10th at 10am, and this site's arrears of \$8,000 will be cleared up. John asked whether sites in arrears are tracked annually and asked the reason for arrearage. Steve replied that economy and also the special assessment are partially responsible, more so than in the past. Paul Carter A113 asked if any portion of arrears is legal fees. Steve replied that legal fees are only incurred on over \$500, over 150 days late, and are added to the statement.

<u>Site Rules question</u>- Ray asked about the previously approved site rules. Bob is working on final copy for board approval and member distribution and expects to have them next meeting, if time allows.

<u>Playground update</u>- Merrick stated that due to heavy rains, he was unable to get the slide installed. He thought it would be difficult to get volunteers on Labor Day wkend.

Ballfield Fertilization- Merrick stated he has no bids yet, but grass is growing well.

<u>Lodge tables</u>-John reported the new tables were purchased at the price of \$117 [instead of \$200] each, thank you to Steve. They were delivered by Allen and carried up by Steve, Allen and Rob.

<u>Water Report</u>- Ray asked about the water report from Granite State, and requested all directors receive a copy. A mailing received previously was a monthly newsletter and not a report, according to Bob.

Handicapped ramp/additional lighting- John stated that once the ramp is set up, he will pursue the lighting. Motion to open floor [John], 2nd [Ray], carried.

Denise Whicher was recalled to announce, along with Elaine Goodberry that the Penny Sale two yrs ago raised \$670. [used for projector] This year's proceeds were \$1378, and were earmarked for an accessibility ramp by the committee, which is much needed. An additional donation was received from Roby's [thanks were given]. Trex material will be used; they have the blessing of the city for the design to specifications which will be constructed between Labor Day and Oktoberfest. [Dedication- ribbon cutting to take place at Oktoberfest] Bob Whicher stated the design will be called "Access Ramp", and asked for volunteers for Monday to move the stairs to the end of the deck at 9am. Several members volunteered, including Bob W., Charley, Larry and Jim Goodberry. Bob asked for volunteers to bring hand tools and yard implements. Merrick suggested that the gutter may need to be extended over the stairs. [separate from ramp project] Susan Mazzola asked why the ramp was delayed, since it was proposed years ago. Directors/members stated that no funds were allocated. John noted that he and Phil had begun preliminary work in 06 on the grounds to prepare for ramp. Steve added that voting a project at annual mtg doesn't mean there are funds, and that a second vote for funds is needed. He added that the board's hands are tied when it comes to funding/spending. In condo associations, often the board acts as trustees to set the budget; and members pay what is needed to support the budget. He suggested that the method of funding needs work, including a 5 yr plan.

CCV1 Mary and Charley Scott offered a donation of \$2500 for the purchase of a water tank for the hill. Ray had estimates from the eliminator for a tank for \$1700, and 60c per ft on pipe. Al Dubois commended the donation, but recommended the board see it as temporary, if used, to be repaid, via a fundraiser. The water tank will be researched further.

Motion to bring back [Steve], 2nd [Ray], carried.

New Business:

<u>Negative Spending</u>-Ray noted that the cushion is diminishing, since the treasurer's report shows us over-budget; that \$450 yr for dues, plus taxes/assessment is inexpensive for a get-away. He recommended forecasting and thinking about future financial plans. Steve added that an active finance committee could develop a 5 yr plan, along with a bylaw committee to address issues.

Security 2009- Ray asked about the annual meeting vote to discontinue security [36/35]. Discussion followed as to whether the vote was advisory or binding. Opinions differed. Example of voting in security at 06 annual mtg, then the board added it to the budget, Julie speculated as an operating expense monthly, rather than a purchase over \$2000. She added that Roberts Rules/Bylaws are generally used to guide the board/association, but that usage is inconsistent, and that some bylaws vague and thereby open to interpretation. Example given- cable TV voted out at one annual mtg, followed by cable being voted in the following year in a board mtg. Directors agreed that annual mtg votes declare projects in/out. A request was made by Bill Wilson for the board to be on one page and discuss further in private if needing to agree on these matters. Running a business in the camp[stopping]- Ray stated having received violations against a member doing car auto body repairs [one bylaw infraction] and running a business [second infraction]; asked the board's recommendations. Rob offered to contact the lawyer. Julie suggested that an official cease and desist letter should preclude attorney involvement; and that the board should agree prior to attorney contact, since it incurs cost. After Rob stated the letter should already have been written, it was stated that these were jointly site/safety violations that had been brought up before.

<u>Behavior at Activities/Dances</u>- Ray led discussion on lewd or inappropriate behaviors and asked the board's input, since some behaviors are unsuitable for a family event. Suggestions were made to fine members, call the police, approaches from directors to ask cooperation, or to leave the situation if uncomfortable. John asked definition of lewd and inebriated, to emphasize relative levels.

<u>Letter from A43 Guest</u>- Ray asked the board what response should be given to this letter. Directors agreed that this is not the association member, no reply is warranted, and that all violations and fines should remain in place. Motion that a copy will be sent to the attorney to keep on file [Ray], 2nd [Merrick], carried.

Additional Beach/Fishing Area lighting- Merrick stated the PSNH cannot put lights on the current poles, since they are too short. He proposed installation of a PSNH pole \$700, with two 250 watt bulbs [cost \$36 per month]. Ray stated since the kids are not driving golfcarts after dark, they are congregating more on the dark beach. Motion to spend \$700 on pole, with two 250 watt bulbs. [Merrick], 2nd [John]. Merrick clarified this as a double light, which would light in two directions. Concerns were raised by Glen that the season is almost over, and funding could come from the 2009 budget. Steve verified the budget projections suggest \$23,000 over. Julie concurred that projecting the light into 2009 budget would be better than more over budget spending. The motion was called to vote. 2 in favor, 4 opposed, 2 abstentions. Motion failed. It was suggested by the board to recall discussion at budget time.

Rob gave thanks to outgoing board members: John, Julie, Steve, and resigned directors Glen and Phil, and especially to Julie for the newsletter. Audience recognized Julie with standing applause.

Motion to Adjourn [Ray], 2nd [John], carried.

Meeting adjourned 11:50am
