"I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also." 2 Timothy 1:5 NIV

This Sunday is mother's day. There is always much emotion around that day for so many folks because of the impact their mother, grandmother, or other significant person who fulfilled that role had in their lives. Sometimes they are the ones who show us what love, patience, and sacrifice means. Sometimes they provided quiet support and just listened.
