

#### The Pastor's Letter

And they exceeded our expectations: They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us." 2 Corinthians 8:5 NIV

Dear Friends

Paul, in talking to the Corinthian church, in urging them to be generous in the offering that was being taken to support the impoverished church in Jerusalem, uses the example of their Macedonian brothers and sisters who gave generously to the cause. It seems that Macedonian churches approached the task by recommitting themselves to the Lord, then going about the task which was successfully completed.



That idea of recommitment to the Lord stuck in my mind as we focus on an intentional stewardship of time, talents, and treasure in the life of our church. For foundational to our existence for over 260 years here at St. James, is each of our commitments to the Lord, then how God then guides us in all areas of our life to support the ministry here in this part of God's vineyard. In fact I would say our response in effectively engaging in God's work in here depends on our commitment to the Lord, and being open to how the Holy Spirit would direct each one of us to respond in the areas of time, talent and treasures.

When we came together in ministry over two and a half years ago, it seemed that this was God's direction for you and me. Quite honestly it has had its challenges. We are not in the same position financially that we were in times past. Fund raising activities have become an important part to fund our ministry. Some of the same talented people who constantly step up to the plate to serve have done their part and then some.

In going forward there are two paths we could take. The one path is to let things go on the way they are, and eventually exhaust resources and people. The other is that of individual recommitment to the Lord, then by the leading of the Holy Spirit find what that means for us in the areas of time, talents and treasure.

This November you will receive a commitment card. In filling out the card, please know that it can be changed if personal circumstances change, but use it as an opportunity to recommit to the Lord, and then ask God what your part should be. I have often felt that the Holy Spirit speaks to each of us to guide us to each of our parts in the body of Christ If we would each take that opportunity then our witness would be the same as the Macedonians. For Paul observes, "they exceeded our expectations."

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, the Western District of the New Jersey Synod met at Crossroads Camp and Retreat Center to worship, celebrate mission on the bounds of our district, and begin prayer, thought, and discussion as we look to the process of electing a new bishop in our synod for the first time in about twenty years! Pastor Murdoch MacPherson ("Mac" as he is called), through his long tenure as a pastor in our synod, led us in a "historical discussion" of previous leaders (Strawchurch's beloved Pastor Ahlers as one of them), and a good overview of the process. We were well represented at the meeting by Marion Martin, Amy Martin, and Pam Van Haneghan. The meeting concluded with a very nice dinner at Crossroads.

In the spring the district will meet to hold an election for a member of the synod council. Please consider being a voting member in the spring. The meeting is informative, you get to meet brothers and sisters of other congregations nearby, and you have a way of having a direct vote on a representative on synod council. It will also be good to attend for it will provide more information on the synod assembly in June when a new bishop is elected.

On a side note, since I was appointed Dean by Bishop Riley it has been a great way to learn about my new synod after serving in Upstate New York Synod for many years. I also can tell you that many of our other brothers and sisters in the Lutheran Vineyard share some of the same challenges and joys as we do!

#### The Advent Wreath Candles



Four candles were burning brightly on the Advent wreath. The room was quiet, so quiet that one could hear the candles begin to speak.

The first candle sighed
