ELIGIBILITY: All entrants must be members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating, U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills, Skate Canada, or a foreign federation. Test requirements for event categories are as of the closing date of July 7, 2007.

RULES: The Competition will be conducted according to the rules of U.S. Figure Skating as set forth in the 2007 Rulebook, except as described herein.

ENTRIES: Entries must be postmarked no later than July 7, 2007. Postage metered mail will not constitute proof of timely mailing. Incomplete entries including entries without payment will be returned. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee, and will require payment of double the entry fee. The Committee reserves the right to limit entries. If applications exceed space availability, the postmark will be used to determine entry acceptance. Once entries are closed No Refunds will be granted except for events cancelled by the Local Organizing Committee (Rule #3235).

Pairs skaters should split the fee (50% each). If a competitor is skating both in singles and pairs, the pairs event will be considered the first event.

Make checks payable to: <u>AAFSC</u>. Fees must accompany the entry form. There will be a \$25 fee charged for all returned checks. Please <u>enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope</u> with your application to receive confirmation, group assignment and a schedule.

RINKS: The rinks measure 200' x 85' with rounded corners and a hockey barrier.

MUSIC: Music will be played from CD-R only. <u>CDs MUST be clearly marked</u> with the skater's name and event on the program side. Skaters MUST bring duplicate copies of music to their scheduled event in case of problems with the CD submitted at registration. While all possible care will be taken, the American Academy FSC assumes no responsibilities or liability due to loss or damage to any CDs. Novice through Senior competitors are requested to submit music as an mp3 file by email to **Jchen428@aol.com**. **NO CASSETTE TAPES**.

AWARDS: Medals will be presented to 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place finishers in each group of Pre-Preliminary through Senior events. Medals will be presented to 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place finishers in each group of Basic Skills through No Test events. Participation medals for other placements will be awarded to finishers in each group of Basic Skills through No Test events. Medals will be presented to the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place finishers of final round events. The Helen Oak Trophy will be presented to the first place finisher of the Juvenile Girls Final Round event. The Frank E. Heaney Trophy will be presented to the first place finisher of the Intermediate Ladies Final Round event.

SCHEDULE: Final schedules will be available at the ICE HOUSE and on the website by August 16, 2007 Skaters are required to check the official bulletin board at the rink for changes in events or times. Posting of such changes or other announcements shall be considered sufficient notice to competitors. Skaters are responsible for being present at their own events, and it is suggested that they be ready to skate at least one hour before the scheduled time. Skaters must register **at least** one hour before the scheduled time of the competition event.

PRACTICE ICE: Practice ice will be available for purchase at the ICE HOUSE throughout the competition.

ADVERTISING: Advertising space is available in our Program Book at very reasonable rates. We encourage you to consider supporting the athletes while promoting your Club, competitions or business.

COMPOSITION OF EVENTS

GENERAL: You may enter the events for which you have passed the required test, or one level higher (i.e., skaters may 'skate up' one level) based on tests passed as of July 7, 2007. Short and long programs are separate events. You may skate at only one level per event category (e.g., Juvenile Free Skate and Intermediate Short Program, but not Juvenile Free Skate and Intermediate Free Skate). The 6.0 system will be used for all events **except**. Novice, Junior, and Senior Short Programs, and Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, and Senior Free Skate events. IJS will be used for these events. U.S. Figure Skating program content rules in effect for the **2008** regional qualifying competitions shall apply.

FINAL ROUNDS: A final round competition will be held for free skating events for Juvenile and Intermediate levels. A maximum of 12 competitors will advance to the final round. Movement to the final round will be determined at the close of free skating competition. The Juvenile Girls Final Round is the Helen Oak Trophy event. The Intermediate Ladies Final Round is the Frank E. Heaney Trophy event.

NOVICE, JUNIOR, SENIOR: Competitors in the Novice, Junior, and Senior short programs and free skate events must **submit their planned elements via** *the Members Only Section of US Figure Skating* website prior to the competition and bring a written copy of the planned element sheet to the competition. There will be **no final rounds** for these levels.

Basic Skills- Please Read Eligibility Rules Carefully

Eligibility requirements (as stated in the Compete with U.S. Competition Manual): The competition is open to ALL skaters who are currently eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills program/club or any other Basic Skills program/club. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

Skaters in other events may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher <u>BUT not both</u> levels in the same event during the same competition and may have passed Pre-preliminary moves in the field. For events that are "Beyond the Basics" (beginner, pre-preliminary and preliminary) the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook # 1032 applies (Basic Skills competitions may include events for skaters who have passed no higher than the Preliminary moves in the field, Preliminary freeskating, Preliminary dance or Adult Bronze free skate tests without applying for a USFS sanction. However, an approval number is required from the appointed Basic Skills representatives.)

Certification of Eligibility

Competitors who are members of a basic skills skating program and who are not members of a USFS club should have their eligibility confirmed by the signature of the skating instructor or coach on the application. Competitors who are members of a USFS club should have their eligibility confirmed by the signature of a club officer or test chair on the application.

Music Program Events - Basic Programs with Music

The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times an element is executed, or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated.

Vocal music is allowed.
