Suggested text for faith sharing: Second Reading from St. John Jn 4:11-16



Beginning this Sunday and continuing for the 2^{nd} Sunday of each month, we will highlight a different ministry that we offer here at St. Ignatius Loyola in the Pastor's Corner. It is by our Baptism that we are incorporated into the Body of Christ, His Church and we are sent on Christ's mission to spread his message of love, healing and service. Each of us has a responsibility to live out our baptism not only by going to church on Sundays, but also by being involved in our parish in serving out her mission.

Today, we are focusing on the Ministry of Consolation. Pam Flanagan is our coordinator and I invite her now to explain just what this ministry is all about. Please consider this ministry as a way to help build and serve St. Ignatius Loyola

The Ministry of Consolation consists of a group of dedicated volunteers who seek to assist and hopefully bring some comfort to fellow parishioners during the wake and funeral of their loved ones. We have been doing this since 1996 and we need help if we are to continue.

There are four ways in which you can assist us:

- 1-Companion goes to the wake, brings a card and cake and expresses condolences on behalf of the parish.
- 2-<u>Greeters-</u>attend the funeral Mass, run off booklets and escort family members who are reading or bringing up the gifts
- 3. <u>Computer people</u>-make up a master program containing the readings and hymns selected by the family, only very basic computer skills are needed.
- 4. <u>Co-ordinators</u> take the phone calls from the rectory regarding funerals and assign the companions, greeters and computer people.

You may choose to do all or one of these tasks.

As you can see from the above, none of these things are difficult. I am sure you have all gone to wakes and funerals and reached out to friends and relatives. This is the same, except you are now reaching out to fellow parishioners on behalf of our parish and showing care and consideration. You will be given training and all of our members will be glad to assist you. We especially appeal to anyone who has been touched by our ministry and would like to do the same for others.

As stated above, we are in desperate need of volunteers and if you could assist, please call the rectory at 931-0056. This is truly not difficult, but is very satisfying on many levels.


