From the Desk of Fr. Seán

It was my intention to write a few words about the Feast of the Lord's Baptism, which we observe this weekend, but there's been so much that has happened within our little town and parish these past two weeks that I would rather spend time reflecting on that.

Every New Year dawns with the hope that troubles, heartache, and sorrow will be far from our doors... We know that it's inevitably going to become part of our history within the year, but we hope and pray those hardships will be few and far between.

It certainly seems to be the experience of a lot of us that this New Year has barely begun and we're already facing a great deal of sorrow and a growing number of challenges... From struggles that are very private to heartaches which are very public; there's a lot of sadness all around us.

I suppose that's the story of life...it has its ups and downs...its highs and lows. We all have these experiences ... but it seems lately that there's been more bad news than good. For instance, within the past week we've had a record number of funerals...each one is the story of a family and their loved one...each one illustrates the tough time a family is going through... some were after a prolonged illness and one was a sudden and traumatic death...The common thread running between all of them is that someone is gone from our midst that was loved and will be missed very much.

Additionally, we have an alarming number of parishioners who are facing some pretty serious illnesses...some are home, and some are hospitalized... each one anxious about what the future holds.

Everyone's feeling a bit edgy... short-tempered... tired... worried... anxious. When tempers flare or nerves are frayed... stop, take a deep breath... and remember that the person you're dealing with may be carrying a pretty awful burden...and none of us wants to make it worse.

As I'm writing this to you, I've only just returned from anointing and praying with Mary Ellen Trodden ~ daughter of Deacon John and his beautiful wife, Ellen. It's been a long journey for their family but they've given Mary Ellen remarkable care and love... something I suspect I would find in any home in our parish. Although bittersweet, there was a beauty in seeing Mary Ellen's parents and her brothers and sister gathered around her bed... praying for her... whispering words of peace and love to her.

As a priest, this is not the first time I've witnessed this... but this is particularly personal. Most of you know that Deacon John and his family have been friends of my own family since my relatives emigrated here from Ireland... John was ordained a deacon one week before I was ordained a priest... he was the Deacon at my First Mass...together with my mother and uncles, he attended parochial school here at St. Joseph's... lifelong friend of my Uncle Peter; it was John's sons who served as pallbearers at my uncle's funeral Mass.

You may be wondering "If this is the fellow who's supposed to lift our spirits and give us hope... he's not doing a very good job of it" but I want you to know that I do have hope...together with Fr. Francis and Deacon John, I have great hope ~ and we find a lot of that hope in <u>YOU</u>.

In all these experiences, I've been reminded of something that I've seen countless times before... in my other parish assignments and in particular, here in Kings Park... As I've made my rounds from sickbeds and hospitals... from funeral homes and parishioner's homes... from a crime scene... and to our parish altar to pray with you... I know you're out there taking care of each other.

Quite simply ... you take care of each other. Whether it's bringing meals... running errands... babysitting... taking someone to the doctor or to Mass... helping with money ... the list goes on and on. But I see you "out there" and I see what you are doing for each other ~ and you do it quietly and unnoticed... you don't look for thanks or praise... you do it because you care.

I wish I could tell you when times will get better ... easier... peaceful. Until that day should come, I know we'll help to take care of each other... and that gives me hope.

Scripture Reflection

The Baptism Of The Lord



Baptism is the most graced moment in our lives. How fitting it is to end the season of Christmas with the feast that makes the whole season actual in our lives. Can we imagine ourselves with all our faults being carried into the waters of Jesus' baptism? Can we believe that we

are all equally part of his rising out of the waters to hear God's voice? What is it that God is speaking to us? Can we hear his voice? This account of the baptism of Jesus did not just link Jesus and John. It taught Christians what baptism should mean for them. They were bought at a great price by the messiah-servant who identified with them in their sinful state. Matthew presents us with a Jesus who is eager to conform to God's saving will. There is only one spirit whom all of us Christians have received at baptism. There is no one single predetermined way for the Spirit to energize us. No elitism, no arrogance, no one format. We cannot capture the Spirit in any single approach to our spirituality. The Spirit will capture us as it wills. Today's feast is a powerful reminder of the vocation to which we are called. It recalls our own baptism, when we began our relationship with God. This is where the planting of the seed of Christian life occurred which will grow and bear fruit as we develop our relationship with God. We are all a member of God's family; our special role is to announce Jesus to the world. Are we here in St. Joseph's up to it?

Katie's Way

Katie Farrell was a beloved daughter, sister, and friend, as well as a devoted mother. Her father is from Kings Park and was a parishioner of St. Joseph Church and her grandmother still resides here.

Last March, she was taken from this world at the age of 23 by an act of senseless violence, leaving her thirteen month old son an orphan.

Katie became unexpectedly pregnant amid trauma induced mental illness. Her doctors told her abortion was her best option considering her circumstances. Katie was determined to keep her son, and rather than take the easy way out, she turned her life around and became healthy. Her son Tyler was born on January 22, 2011, on the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision, and Katie loved and cared for him unconditionally.

In a hopeless situation, Katie found the courage to save her son from certain abortion. In turn, her son saved her by giving her the purpose she needed to turn her life around. Katie's legacy is the simple message that a pregnancy may be unplanned and inconvenient, but a child is not a mistake.

Tragically, the father of Katie's son, who suffered from mental illness, took her life and his own. A month before she left us, Katie wrote an essay for a college class explaining why she chose to keep her son and why she believed in the pro-life cause.
