From the Desk of Fr. Seán

On Friday of this coming week, people of diverse creeds, ethnic backgrounds, ages and political affiliations will converge on our nation's capitol for the 40th Annual March for Life. This yearly event has seen increased participation with each passing year, and the widening numbers of marchers reflect the beautiful mosaic of America's citizens. It has come to be the cornerstone from which most pro-life initiatives commence.

The date is significant because it marks the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision in the case of Roe-vs.-Wade and the legalization of abortion in January of 1973. So, for 39 years increasing numbers of America's sons and daughters have traveled to Washington to prayerfully march, meet with their congressional delegations, and continue to witness to the belief that all life is sacred and should be protected \sim from conception until natural death.

One might wonder if this 40 year vigil has yielded any results. The horror and tragedy of abortion continues to leave its scars on individuals and on our society. While in the short term it may appear to solve the challenges a pregnancy can bring... in the long term it leaves grievous wounds with far-reaching effects.

How do I know this? Because I have been personally involved in conversations of a pastoral nature with those who have lived through this horror. I've witnessed their tears, their anguish and regret... the heartbreak of the aftermath. In the midst of heated rhetoric it becomes all too easy to demonize those whose circumstances have led them to such a decision. It has never been my experience, and I've had quite a few, to spend time with someone who blithely or easily arrived at that decision. Quite the opposite... they continue to struggle, to grieve, and most often... to regret.

There are no easy answers or solutions... this will always be an issue which will see a wide gulf of opinion. Obviously, for us as Catholics, we know what the Church teaches regarding the gift of life. You would have to be living under a rock to not know what our position is. Yet even within our life together as Church, there is a difference of opinion.

How then do we bring about the change that many of us long to see? How do we advance the message that each and every human life is a gift from God and thus has a dignity that must be safeguarded?

Well, I'm not convinced that heated debate or rhetoric will accomplish this... demonizing or targeting abortion survivors is not helpful and it often violates the human dignity we claim to safeguard... the use of language and tactics that incite division is counterproductive.

Browbeating those who do not espouse the same belief as us will not accomplish anything. It will probably do just the opposite. Rather, a conversion of mind and heart is the path by which we can bring about the change we hope for in our culture. If we hope to convince others of the dignity of life in the womb... of its dignity during our earthly pilgrimage... of the dignity of each life until its natural end... then we must demonstrate our belief not just with words but in the way we dwell, and interact with one another.

Let us continue to pray for the conversion of minds and hearts as regards the sanctity of human life... not just on Friday but always. Our regular 8:45 AM Parish Mass on Friday will be for the Sanctity of All Human Life. If you are not joining the parish bus that is headed to Washington, perhaps you might consider coming to Mass that morning? Let us be people of compassion rather than people who sit in judgment. May we be the people who seek to foster healing and forgiveness for the survivors of abortion and by virtue of that, demonstrate the dignity of life we claim to uphold. As always, if your life has been affected by the sorrow of abortion, please know that our parish clergy are available to you to help foster your healing and reconciliation.

May God inspire and guide us in this noble and sacred task.

Scripture Reflection

2nd Sunday In Ordinary Time



At Cana in Galilee, Jesus performed the first of His signs revealing His glory to His disciples, and later to all

the nations. He has revealed as well the manifestation of the Spirit who distributes different gifts as he chooses.

The steward at the wedding knew how things were done. You serve the good wine while people are sober enough to care about vintages. And as the celebration goes on – wedding parties could last for days back then – you gradually serve up some all-but-undrinkable beverages. Who would notice on the third day what they were drinking?

He is the first one in John's gospel to greet the paradox of the kingdom: the last will be first, the first last, and the choice wine comes up when you least expect it. You know not the day nor the hour for anything, so be alert at all times and do not be surprised by the surprises. The steward, more interested in serving the guests than pondering this event, hurries off to do his job. But the disciples come to have faith in Jesus after this display of authority over the elements of water and wine. We too find our faith strengthened in the water and the wine. We know the choice wine is saved for the last meal, the only one we need in the kingdom.

We are challenged to offer some of our choice wine to those who could most use it. Share companionship – the real human and holy communion of presence – with someone who suffers loneliness without community. Invite them home to dinner, go for a walk, maybe even bring them to church. Give someone the gift of being present to them fully and without reservation.





Katie's Way

Katie Farrell was a beloved daughter, sister, and friend, as well as a devoted mother. Her father is from Kings Park and was a parishioner of St. Joseph Church and her grandmother still resides here.

Last March, she was taken from this world at the age of 23 by an act of senseless violence, leaving her thirteen month old son an orphan.

Katie became unexpectedly pregnant amid trauma induced mental illness. Her doctors told her abortion was her best option considering her circumstances. Katie was determined to keep her son, and rather than take the easy way out, she turned her life around and became healthy. Her son Tyler was born on January 22, 2011, on the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision, and Katie loved and cared for him unconditionally.

In a hopeless situation, Katie found the courage to save her son from certain abortion. In turn, her son saved her by giving her the purpose she needed to turn her life around. Katie's legacy is the simple message that a pregnancy may be unplanned and inconvenient, but a child is not a mistake.

Tragically, the father of Katie's son, who suffered from mental illness, took her life and his own. A month before she left us, Katie wrote an essay for a college class explaining why she chose to keep her son and why she believed in the pro-life cause. She also pledged in this essay to take her son to the March for Life in Washington DC for his second birthday, to "show everyone the beautiful outcome from not choosing abortion."
