# From the Desk of Fr. Seán

In talking with people, I've discovered that a good many folks feel that we "lost time" in the immediate aftermath of the Big Storm. We were enjoying a very pleasant Fall season and then things just kind of fell apart... Halloween all but disappeared and before we knew it Thanksgiving was upon us. Here we are now at the Second Sunday of Advent and in another two weeks it's Christmas!

For some, a lot of energy went into cleaning up and getting things "back to normal"... that was followed by our ongoing effort to help those who suffered the worst... A lot of folks are just plain tired... worn out... and not feeling particularly merry just yet.

In many ways it reminds me of how people were feeling this time of year following the events of  $9/11 \sim$  there was a sense that we had all passed through so much and it seemed an effort to try and get into the spirit of the season.

The storm alone produced a great deal of misery... but there's been a lot of other things that have been weighing heavily on folks... worries about jobs and money... constant bad news overseas and sloughing it out as we try and work towards peace and security... concern for our armed forces... family, friends and neighbors who are battling through some serious illnesses... the trials and cares of daily life... the list goes on and on.

Listening to the words of "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" I couldn't help but look at the radio and ask? "How???"

I've been thinking about this during the past week... and, I keep coming back to the familiar words of an old Advent favorite: "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

As you know, Emmanuel means "God with us"... perhaps the words of this familiar hymn could really be the expressions of our heart's earnest prayer these days?

Come Lord Jesus... Come and be with us in these tough and uncertain days... Come and steady our faltering steps and hold our trembling hands... Come and calm our anxious and frightened hearts... Come and soothe our weary and tired souls... Come and be with us and whisper gently to our troubled spirits that all will be well.

How???

Because You are with us... You are Emmanuel... God is with us... All will be well.

There have been any number of you that have said to me "If it wasn't for my faith, Father..." or "Father, I don't know how people with no faith make it through..."

Faith in what??

Faith in holding fast ...to the truth ...the promise ...the hope ...that God is with us.

In all life's storms, difficulties, heartbreaks and strife... God is with us... He doesn't guide us over them... or under them... or around them... but God is there with us... as we go through them and survive them.

In my heart and soul, I believe that... I hope you do too.

The Lord has done great things leading his people out of slavery to the glorious splendor of Jerusalem. Let us make ready the way of the Lord by abounding in love and in works of justice.

Election campaigns too often degenerate into character assassinations. Past foolishness and failures are highlighted to discredit almost every candidate. The good they may have done is ignored and their errors are not only recalled but exaggerated out of context. In politics, there is little mercy for mistakes and there are few opportunities to make a fresh start.

In our relationship with God, things are very different. Though our sins may be scarlet, he is willing to make them white as snow. There is the constant invitation not only to make a fresh start but to begin a radically new way of living. No matter how selfish we may have been, he has shared our human nature to enable us to change direction and to move closer to his approach to living. Aware of how easily we postpone such radical conversion, the church offers us annual reminders of his coming to focus our hearts as well as our minds on his presence among us.

Advent is such an alerting and preparing time. Today's gospel is a timely reminder through the words of John the Baptist that Christmas is about more than food and drink, presents and pleasure, comfort and contentment. It is about preparing a way to let God have an ever-increasing say in our lives.

# Katie's Way

Katie Farrell was a beloved daughter, sister, and friend, as well as a devoted mother. Her father is from Kings Park and was a parishioner of St. Joseph Church and her grandmother still resides here.

Last March, she was taken from this world at the age of 23 by an act of senseless violence, leaving her thirteen month old son an orphan.

Katie became unexpectedly pregnant amid trauma induced mental illness. Her doctors told her abortion was her best option considering her circumstances. Katie was determined to keep her son, and rather than take the easy way out, she turned her life around and became healthy. Her son Tyler was born on January 22, 2011, on the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision, and Katie loved and cared for him unconditionally.

In a hopeless situation, Katie found the courage to save her son from certain abortion. In turn, her son saved her by giving her the purpose she needed to turn her life around. Katie's legacy is the simple message that a pregnancy may be unplanned and inconvenient, but a child is not a mistake.

Tragically, the father of Katie's son, who suffered from mental illness, took her life and his own. A month before she left us, Katie wrote an essay for a college class explaining why she chose to keep her son and why she believed in the pro-life cause. She also pledged in this essay to take her son to the March for Life in Washington DC for his second birthday, to "show everyone the beautiful outcome from not choosing abortion."

We intend to keep this promise. 

# St. Joseph's Church, Kings Park VOLUNTEER'S CODE OF CONDUCT

Our children are the most important gifts God has entrusted to us. As a volunteer, I promise to strictly follow the rules and guidelines in this Volunteer's Code of Conduct as a condition of my providing services to the children and youth of our parish.

# As a volunteer, I will:

- Treat everyone with respect, loyalty, patience, integrity, courtesy, dignity, and consideration.
- Avoid situations where I am alone with children and/or youth at Parish activities.
- Use positive reinforcement rather than criticism, competition, or comparison when working with children and/or youth.
- Refuse to accept expensive gifts from children and/or youth or their parents without prior written approval from the pastor or administrator.
- Refrain from giving expensive gifts to children and/or youth without prior written approval from the parents or guardian and the pastor or administrator.
- Report suspected abuse to the pastor, administrator, or appropriate supervisor and the New York State Central Registry (1-800-342-3720). I understand that failure to report suspected abuse to civil authorities is, according to the law, a misdemeanor.
- Cooperate fully in any investigation of abuse of children and/or youth.

#### As a volunteer, I will not:

- Smoke or use tobacco products in the presence of children and/or youth.
- Use, possess, or be under the influence of alcohol at any time while volunteering.
- Use, possess, or be under the influence of illegal drugs at any time.
- Pose any health risk to children and/or youth (i.e., no fevers or other contagious situations).
- Strike, spank, shake, or slap children and/or youth.
- Humiliate, ridicule, threaten, or degrade children and/or youth.
- Touch a child and/or youth in a sexual or other inappropriate manner.
- Use any discipline that frightens or humiliates children and/or youth.
- Use profanity in the presence of children and/or youth.

I understand that as a volunteer working with children and/or youth, I am subject to a thorough background check including criminal history. I understand that any action inconsistent with this Code of Conduct or failure to take action mandated by the Code of Conduct may result in my removal as a volunteer with children and/or youth of St. Joseph's Church.
