Successful Spring Fling '05



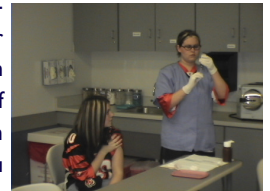
SPRING FLING '05 - during blue and white day

ify for an externship a student must have successfully completed Lab II for Diploma students or Lab V for Degree students. The externship should coincide with the last quarter of study at TEC. Tanna looks forward to working with all externship students!

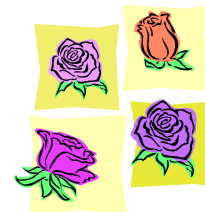
Our next group to graduate will be the June 04 group and they are just now starting to get involved in the job hunting process.

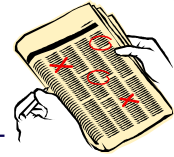

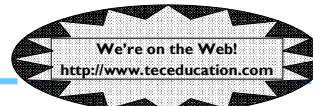

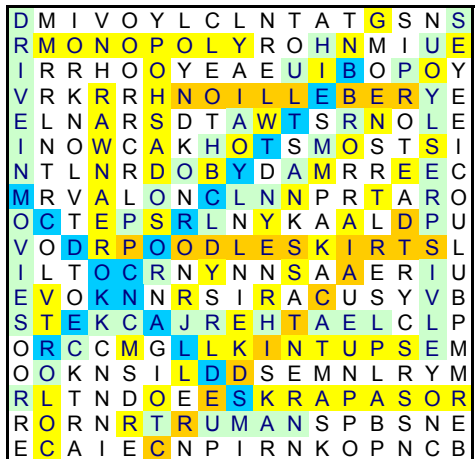
