## Leaves in the Round Washcloth By Belinda Daniel (on the Knitted Lace List)

This is a reorganization of a Shetland lace pattern found in "Heirloom Knitting" by Sharon Miller.

It takes one ball of sugar and cream.

This is knit in the round on 4 DPs using a 5th DP to knit with.

I used 4mm needles for this washcloth (I knit loose).

Cast on 8 sts. I put 4 sts over 2 needles at this point. Knit 1 round

- 1. .YO, K1 8 x (using 4 DPs, placing 4 sts on each DP.)
- 2. Knit all even rounds.
- 3. YO, K3, YO, K1. 4x
- 4. K
- 5. YO, K5, YO, K1. 4x
- 6. K
- 7. YO, K7, YO, K1. 4x
- 8. K
- 9. YO, K1, YO, K2, K3tog, K2, YO, K1, YO K1. 4x.
- 10. K
- 11. YO, K3, YO, K1, K3tog, K1, YO, K3, YO, K1. 4x etc.
- 12 K
- 13. YO, K5, YO, K3tog, YO, K5, YO, K1.
- 14. K
- 15. YO, K7, YO, K1, YO, K7, YO, K1.
- 16. K

The next row is the tricky one, in order to keep the stitch count correct and the YOs lining up.

- 17. YO, K1, YO, K2, K3tog, K1, K2tog, YO, K1, YO, SSK, K1, K3tog, K2, YO, K1, YO, K1.
- 18. K
- 19. (YO, K3, YO, K1, K3tog, K1) x2, YO, K3, YO, K1.
- 20 K
- 21. (YO, K5, YO, K3tog) x2, YO, K5, YO, K1.
- 22. K
- 23. (YO, K7, YO, K1) x2, YO, K7, YO, K1.
- 24. K

The next row is a similar tricky one as above.

- 25. YO, K1, YO, K2, K3tog, K1, K2tog, YO, K1, YO, SSK, K1, K3tog, K1, K2tog, YO, K1, YO, SSK, K1, K3tog, K2, YO, K1, YO, K1..
- 26. K
- 27. (YO, K3, YO, K1, K3tog, K1) x3, YO, K3, YO, K1.
- 28. K
- 29. (YO, K5, YO, K3tog) x3, YO, K5, YO, K1.
- 30. K
- 31. Purl one round.
- 32. Cast off in purl or if you know it, use Icelandic bindoff.
