### **CHEVALIER RESOURCE CENTRE**

The centre is on a hillside alongside the Sacred Heart Monastery at Kensington. Many bus-routes serve the area. It is 10 minutes by bus from the CBD.

The rooms are comfortable, most with one single bed. There a few double rooms. Alcohol is permitted (on a BYOG basis).

A drawback is that the number of beds is limited. We expect a large number of visitors from interstate and regional areas. Early booking is essential. Overflow accommodation is available at a local motel.

Heaps of Fun

Previous schools have been great learning experiences but they have also been places where music, singing and dancing have meant that participants have enjoyed a marvellous time. As a break from the language some time will be made available for free classes each afternoon in various cultural activities for those who are interested, eg singing in Irish, bodhrán, feadóg stáin (tin whistle), rince seite (set dancing). Language activities will continue simultaneously for those who prefer this.

It is also intended that there will be evening entertainment sessions, including an aoi-chainteoir (guest speaker), tráth na gceist (table quiz) and airneán (late night musical and social activities).

There will also be a ceolchoirm (concert) on the final evening, which will be open to the general public.

It is also likely there will be a turas (trip) to the 1798 memorial at Waverley Cemetery on the Monday morning for those who are interested.

#### IRISH LANGUAGE WINTER SCHOOL

A Scoil Gheimhridh, or Winter School on the Irish Language, will be held at the Chevalier Resource Centre, Kensington from Friday evening 10<sup>th</sup> June to noon Monday 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2005.
