2007 HIGHLIGHTS:

We also had the opportunity to have 'our voices' heard for a number of industry consultations for future arts growth and planning. We currently have 18 financial members and with 2008 renewal notices sent out and due for renewal by 20th December 2007, I hope that you all consider renewing your 2008 memberships and support the concept, aims and mission statement of this pro-active network of professional artists in the region - remember that 'United we stand with a voice to make changes'!!



In June we were offered the opportunity to coordinate the **CQU Library Showcase** display, which of course we jumped at. This now gives us the opportunity to feature and coordinate **3-D works** at the Central Queensland University library every 2-3 months. We also have been given the opportunity to curate and coordinated all the future 'visual arts' around the CQU Mackay campus. Head of Campus Dr Trevor Davison and Library Manager Pauline McNee are fully supportive of Orange Gecko Art Network's collaborative involvement with CQU. We have held three **CQU Library showcase** exhibitions since June. They were:

This challenging and creative program provides professional studio/workplace-oriented experiences that will extend your understanding and appreciation of arts-related concepts, propositions and contemporary professional practices, assisting in new opportunities for work in the creative industries. The Master of Contemporary Arts will help you enhance the following skills and attributes:

1. Problem-solving and critical thinking within the contemporary arts (Visual arts, gallery practices, Digital design and Theatre) disciplines

- 2. In-depth knowledge of your chosen field of study within the contemporary arts and the ability to apply this in practice
- 3. Analytical and research skills
- **4.** Effective communication across a range of contexts, through practical, written and oral presentations
- **5.** Development of local and global perspective's within the disciplines of contemporary arts
- **6.** Appreciation of the impact of social, ethical and environmental change particularly how it impacts on, and is predicated by the visual arts, theatre, gallery practices, digital design and contemporary music
- 7. Learn and practise correct occupational health and safety procedures that apply to owner/operator arts businesses and group workplace environments.
