BRISBANE VALLEY RAIL TRAIL

SEQCatchments (SEQC), in partnership with other groups, has been commissioned to develop a natural resource management plan for the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail. The trail extends from Wulkuraka, through the Pine Mountain district to Blackbutt.

To help develop the plan, SEQC would like to capture the views of local landholders about the line, its history and relevance to other activities in the district. Landholder views about how the conservation and recreational opportunities provided by the line can be enhanced would also be valued.

We are also interested in documenting the many and varied vegetation species along the line and learning more about how the rail corridor has been incorporated into local fire management plans.

SEQC is aware there are many long-term residents still living in the Pine Mountain district who would have photos and valued memories of the rail line and the district. We would welcome the opportunity to talk to them. SEQC hopes to conduct a "morning tea" at the Ipswich Art Gallery for Pine Mountain residents with "stories to share" about their district. We would like to capture the event and the stories on film. As yet, no date has been set for the morning tea.

LOCAL BRIDLE TRAIL UPDATE

In February 2008, Ipswich City Council commenced the planning phase for the Pine Mountain Local Bridle Trail (PMLBT) project. The aim of the project was to establish a bridle trail network within the Pine Mountain District for the benefit of the local community. The PMLBT is intended to function as a multi–user trail circuit for local horse riders, hikers/walkers and leisure cyclists (mountain biking). Opportunities investigated for consideration in forming part of the bridle trail network included unformed/unmade roads, existing road reserves, council owned land and the future Brisbane Valley Rail Trail (BVRT).

Stage 1 of the PMLBT includes sections of Pine Mountain Quarry Rd, Farrell Rd, Russells Rd, Trowers Rd, Mahons Rd and the BVRT. The combined distance of stage 1 is approx 9Km (includes BVRT– Borallon Station Rd – Bayley Rd). Stage 1 is near completion, subject to installation of trailhead signage at the Cricket Pitch. Stage 2 is subject to further investigation. For more information, please contact the Secretary (see details below).
