





2021-2022 Oklahoma State Poet Laureate Joe Russell Kreger

Joe Russell Kreger from Tonkawa was appointed to serve as the 2021-2022 Oklahoma State Poet Laureate by Oklahoma J. Kevin Stitt in April 2021. A farmer and rancher by trade, Kreger was introduced to poetry at a young age by his father, yet his venture into creative writing didn't begin until he was 56 years old, when he began using poetry to document and express his life experiences. A self-described "cowboy poet," Kreger has published two books on poetry, "Lookin' at Life" and "Still Lookin.' His books and albums have set sales records among cowboy poets of his era. Since taking up poetry, Kreger has given over 150 poetry readings and presentations in the region.

- 12-line poem
- 2 stanzas
- 7 lines in the first stanza; 5 lines in the second
- 8 or 10 syllables per line, except in the 7th and 12th lines
- 7th and 12th lines are a refrain
- The refrain comes from the opening word or phrase of the poem

Continued from page 1... award-winning poet, artist and writer. Her creative and technical work has appeared in books, magazines and newspapers. Her writing in fiction, non-fiction, screenplay, stage play, and poetry, Shepherd is the recipient of over 400 writing awards in local, regional, national, and international contests. She was the American Christian Writers' Writer of the Year (twice) and received a Readers Choice Award from *miller's pond*, the Creme de la Creme from Norman Galaxy of Writers (two years back to back), and a Creme de la Creme from Mid-Oklahoma Writers. She has been a Finalist for OWFI's Creme de la Creme award eleven times.



Rose State Writers Conference presented her with a trophy for the Outstanding Author Award for 2016. She won First Place/ Best of Show at the 2017 Oklahoma State Fair and was named the "Voice of the Fair - Poet" and received the same award and title in 2019. She is also a "Lone Stars Poet" and a "Woody Guthrie Poet" and honored to be a former Nominee for Poet Laureate of the State of Oklahoma. Barbara founded <u>Art Affair</u> <u>Annual Literary Contests</u>, sponsoring its categories for poets and writers for more than a decade.
