### <u>September's Poetry Form</u> ~ A Ballad (from *www.literarydevices.com*)

A ballad is a <u>narrative</u> poem that originally was set to music. Ballads were first created in medieval France, and the word ballad comes from the French term *chanson balladée*, which means "dancing song." Ballads then became popular in Great Britain, and remained so until the nineteenth century. The meaning has changed somewhat in the present day to refer to any slow love song.

As ballads were originally meant to be lyrics set to dancing music, there is a noticeable musical quality to the <u>rhythm</u> of the lines. The typical "ballad <u>meter</u>" was an alternation between lines in iambic tetrameter and iambic <u>trimeter</u>. Ballads were generally written in quatrains with a regular <u>rhyme</u> scheme of ABCB. However, there were many different variations on the meter and rhyme of traditional ballads depending on their geographical origin. The main feature in all ballads was their narrative structure and <u>repetition</u> of certain lines or even whole stanzas.

There are several songs still popular today that have been passed down through the generations that fit the definition of ballad. For example, the following lines come from the very popular Irish ballad "Danny Boy":

Oh Danny boy, the pipes, the pipes are calling From glen to glen, and down the mountain side The summer's gone, and all the flowers are dying 'Tis you, 'tis you must go and I must bide.

In addition to being an active member of the Poetry Society of Oklahoma, Rob is also a member of Windmill Poets and an active participant of Full Circle Last Sunday Poetry Readings and Oklahoma Voices-1<sup>st</sup> Sunday Poets at IAO. He has won several poetry awards and is published in *Native Tongues* (a literary publication of SNU) and *Poetry Is For Everyone* - editor Mary Chase and *Red Earth Revisited* -editor Ed Roberts. Rob also has a self-published poetry chapbook entitled *Winds of Change*. He is an advocate in the LGTBQ+ community.

Rob is a member OKC First Church of the Nazarene where he is involved in the choir and writing poetry for Advent and Lent.
