# Chaplain's Corner

#### Rod Green, Chaplain



"My friend just died. I don't know what to do." This has been my mind set the whole month of December 2015 and the first few days of January 2016. I lost several relatives and family friends in December 2015 and on January 2, 2016, received news that Raymond "Butch" Garrett had passed away. I served in Vietnam with Butch, as members of Company A, 1st Battalion, 502nd PIR, 101st Airborne Division.

I wish you could say you get used to people dying. I never have. I don't want to. It tears a hole through me whenever somebody I love dies, no matter the circumstances. But I don't want it to "not matter". I don't want it to be something that just passes. My scars are a testament to the love and the relationship that I had for and with that person, If the scar is deep, so was the love. Scars are a testament to life. Scars are a testament that I can love deeply and live deeply and be cut, or even gouged, and that I can heal and continue to live and continue to love. The scar tissue is stronger than the original flesh ever was. Scars are a testament of life and are only visible to people who can't see past them.

As for grief, you'll find it comes in waves. When the ship is first wrecked, you're drowning, with wreckage all around you. Everything floating around you reminds you of the beauty and the magnificence of the ship that was but is no more. All you can do is float. You find some piece of the wreckage and hang on for a while. Maybe it is some physical thing. Maybe it is a happy memory or a photograph. Maybe it is a person who is also floating. For a while, all you can do is float. Stay alive.

In the beginning, the waves are 100 feet tall and crash over you without mercy. They come 10 seconds apart and don't even give you time to catch your breath. All you can do is hang on and float. After a while, maybe weeks, you will find the waves are still 100 feet tall, but they come further apart. When they come, they still crash all over you and wipe you out. But in between, you can breathe, you can function. You never know what is going to trigger the grief. It might be a song, a picture, a smell. It can be just about anything and the wave comes crashing. But in between the waves there is life.

Somewhere, down the line, and it is different for everybody, you find that the waves are only 80 feet tall or maybe 50 feet tall. While they still come, they come further apart. You can see them coming. An anniversary, a birthday, Christmas or some other special event and prepare yourself. When it washes over you, you know that somehow you will come out the other side. Soaking wet, sputtering, still hanging on to some tiny piece of the wreckage but you will come out. (The preceding was a letter from an 80 year old guy, explaining how to deal with death and grief).

For us veterans, many of us have seen death from another angle and those memories live with us. The older we get, it seems the more these waves are coming. I have mentioned this in previous articles, "If you are drowning in life, I know a savior that walks on water". I hope you know him too, as he conquered death and promises eternal life.

The ad announcing our reunion in the *DAV Magazine* generated numerous inquiries, some quite interesting...like the following email received from Don Loomis, CWO-2 who was a helicopter pilot in Vietnam from April 1968 to April 1969. He served with the 101 Aviation Battalion before being selected to start a new General Support Company with the 163rd Aviation Company. He states that is where he did most of his flying, making runs to the PX for some Colonel or General to combat assaults all over the AO or log missions where he would fly some battalion commander for the day and take on whatever job he had for him. He also was selected to fly VIPs from time to time because, "the chief of staff liked me" and "I was a little crazy and got \*#%& done". "We saved a lot of lives when Dustoff couldn't go in and get the wounded out". Don provided a photo of a VIP he flew around the AO in I Corps; it was of him, Gloria and Jimmy Stewart. In my reply I mentioned that my unit, A Co. 1/502, was supposed to see Jimmy Stewart but we had to leave FSB T-Bone on a mission and we actually saw the helicopter coming in for a landing as we left. He wrote back, "LOL, what a hoot as I was the guy who flew them into T-Bone and that's where the photo was taken". Small world, isn't it? Loomis reports that in 1994 he attended a Jimmy Stewart Marathon and after going through a bunch of cops and security people, that photo of him with the Stewarts kept opening the way and he got to their

trailer. He had a guy take the photo inside and asked that the Stewarts autograph it. He says he heard Gloria Stewart yell out, "He's here?" Both Gloria and Jimmy Stewart came outside and spent time with him. Don Loomis hopes to make the reunion in Vegas. I hope we get to see him there too. # NORFOLK, VA

#### THE 101ST AIRBORNE DIVISION VIETNAM VETERANS





Our reunion this year will be held in Norfolk, VA during the week of September 7-11, 2016. When this location was first discussed, there was concern that this was a Navy town and perhaps it wouldn't be a wise choice. We have since come to realize there is more to see here than just ships. A great deal of America's history was formed in Virginia and Norfolk has many interesting things to see and do. For those of us who served in the Army, the Douglas MacArthur Memorial would be a site to visit. Other sites to see would be the Chrysler Museum of Art, Norfolk Botanical Gardens, the USS Wisconsin battleship, the Nauticus National Maritime Museum and the Armed Forces Memorial. A little farther down the road is Virginia Beach, about 18 miles away, and to the north 46 miles lies Williamsburg, VA with its long history dating back to the 17th century. Our Vice President, Ed "Doc" Barbour and Sgt. at Arms, Bill Ramsey did recon on the city and hotel and assured us that it will be a great place to hold our reunion.

Our host hotel for this special event is the Sheraton Norfolk Waterside Hotel, located at 777 Waterside Drive, Norfolk, VA 23510. The dates for the reunion are September 7-11, 2016. The main events of the reunion begin early Friday and Saturday; but to promote camaraderie, we would like for everyone to arrive a few days early. This will give adequate time to see the sites and visit with our buddies from some 45+ years ago when we met in Vietnam. Our special room rate is \$109.00 per night plus 14% tax and a \$2.00 per day flat bed tax. This group rate will be honored for our members three (3) days before the group arrival and three (3) days after group departure, based on availability. Please stay at the reunion hotel as the cost of our hospitality and banquet rooms is based on the number of hotel guest rooms that are reserved under the organizations room block. The City of Norfolk will also reward us with \$200 paid toward our hotel master account if we have 50 rooms or more reserved for one night. Please reserve early and stay with the group. The cut-off date to reserve a room at our special rate is August 8, 2016.

As is always the case, the Reunion Registration and the Hotel Registration are two separate items so be sure you register early for both. There is a Reunion Registration Form in this newsletter that should be completed and returned to the 101st Secretary with your registration fee as soon as possible. Then you should contact the hotel to reserve your room. You may call the <u>Hotel Reservation Department at 800-325-3535</u>. In order to receive the group rate, callers must identify their affiliation with the **Vietnam Veterans 101st Airborne Division Organization**. \*You must tell them the name of the group in this manner to avoid any confusion with the 101st Airborne Association out of Ft. Campbell, KY who will hold its convention at the same hotel in August 2016.

One of our members Raymond "Butch" Garret passed away on January 2, 2016. He served with A company of the 1st of the 502nd from March 1968 to March 1969.





In recent years, Jim Mathews has been our coordinator for the color guard. He's been ill for a few months now and in a recent phone conversation said he wanted to attend this year. He plans to bring the flags, web gear, helmets and rubber duck rifles so we can be a part of the massing of the colors event held on Saturday morning, April 23.
