The most exciting moments were when the Padlina family won BOB in open show A with a homebred junior doe! New youth member Jack Guiliano won BOB in Youth show A, then with a combined open/youth in show B, Jack won BOB again with his junior Doe! A very exciting showing all around for the Rhinelanders. Three more Rhinelanders went to new exhibitors at that show, all very excited about their calico rabbits!



BLUES REPORT

The progression of the development of the Blue variety of Rhinelander is rolling right along with very promising outcomes. Since my last report, the first litter of F1 crosses are 5 months old, and the buck with the best type has been bred back to a Blue/Fawn Harlequin doe. She is due on August 26th. The first F1 litter had 7 kits, 6 of which were marked quite a bit like a Rhinelander: 3 bucks, 3 does. They have many faults in their markings, which was expected, but all have full face markings, sides spots, some nicely separated, some congested, mostly broken spine markings. One or two have full spine markings. The buck that was used to breed back to the Harlequin doe already had 1 dark slate blue side spot. They all have flyback fur, not rollback like the Harlequin. They are all loaded with the typical Rhinelander energy and personality. The above Harle doe was loaned to me with a baby blue Harle doe, who now

has a litter of F1's but by an unrelated buck as the father of the first litter. There is one buck and one doe that was kept in that litter. There are many possibilities upcoming to the mixing and matching, always striving to keep the type, personality and improve the markings till they come in line to our current standard. I have shown them to 6 different judges and they have all commented that I was anywhere from 2-4 generations ahead of where they expected I would be with the first cross. Joey Shultz was very impressed with them, and said the doe I showed him, if she had a complete spine marking would have been competitive in that day's show. She has about 5 nicely separated spots/side.

Dave Gerling (NY) is starting another line using his own Harlequins and Rhinelanders and Logan Jacot (OH) is beginning his own also. The Carters (CA) and Becky Ruegsegger (CA) are getting Blues when they are in the part of development where you don't have to keep Harlequins. I think other people have contacted me about helping at this point, but I will have to check my notes.

At a show this past weekend, I had 2 requests for Blues from people that had just heard about them, not knowing they were in development, so it looks like the interest is there.

Please contact me if you are interested in developing your own line of Blues.
