

"hooked". Now I raise blue, red and black Norwich Croppers, Parlor


Tumblers, Olde Style Saddle Muffed Tumblers, Portuguese Tumblers and "free

#### The First Hatch

Jan. 28, 2013

Ok, so waiting for my first hatch this year is far more nerve racking than last year. Put my first pair together hoping for dark colors.

Getting them mated was the easy part and the first egg came along in good time but only one. So that was a little disappointing, not wanting anything to happen to the one and only I did little to disturbed the pair. Handling the egg only to check for fertilization and then once again yesterday evening, sure enough there was pipping going on!

So far today no luck, the squab should have hatched. There are no signs of life, all pipping has stopped and holding the egg to light shows no movement. My assistants (Dusty & Max) and I vote to wait one more day just in case.

Jan. 29

There is no pipping or signs of it, holding the egg to the light shows the squab is not alive. Upon opening the egg it was revealed the right leg was under the right wing and wrapped over the top of the squab's head preventing it from being able to turn itself as it pipped.

This is the first time that I have ever examined anything like that, didn't know what I would learn, if anything, but thought it was worth a try. Just wanted to know why the little one didn't make it.

I thought it was interesting and wanted to share what I found after carefully peeling the egg open.


