This was the case with issue #5. The Jim Valentino/Sam de la Rosa art was good, but not spectacular. I believe that a "re-capping" or explanation of sorts is necessary to familiarize some readers with the situation, but I also feel that some of the re-telling should be less visible and minimized in order to highlight the alternate reality that story focused on.
