Course Objective:

To provide the student with the means to dissect, analyze and prepare a script for direction.

Required Text:

Play Directing by Francis Hodge
The following plays must be read:

All My Sons by Arthur Miller
Our Town by Thornton Wilder
Taming of the Shrew by William Shakespeare
The Three Sisters by Anton Chekhov
Waiting for Godot by Samuel Beckett
A Streetcar Named Desire by Tennessee Williams
The Odd Couple by Neil Simon

Required Materials:

Three ring notebook to be used as a prompt book

Course Description:

This course will take the student through the process of analyzing a script in terms of given circumstances, dramatic action, language, mood, character, etc, in order to prepare the student to direct the play.

Course Requirements:

The student will prepare a useable prompt book including analysis, prop list, costume list, set requirements, and lighting requirements. The book will include a copy of the script mounted on 8x11½ paper and ready for blocking notation.
