<u>Guest Speaker for May 25th</u>: <u>BILL CONAWAY: Pixels and Resolution in Digital Photography</u>

An introduction of Bill: Bill Conaway is research scientist at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and has led a group that designs and deploys a variety of airborne remote sensing systems. Bill is a dive and photo club member of Carol's from Livermore's VDM: Photo Geeks (Vaqueros del Mar), and has agreed to present a very informative program to AIM this month. He and his wife, Mari, have been scuba divers since 1997. They are avid dive travelers and both enjoy the challenges and rewards of underwater photography. Both are AIM Film Festival fans having been to all of our festivals to date...and will be here this year as well. The program is very informative and timely. He will also be sharing some local California images as well....time permitting

About the Program: *Pixels and Resolution in Digital Photography* Bill will lead a presentation on pixels and resolution in digital photography, particularly as these topics relate to the shift from film-based to digital media. The talk touches on topics ranging from the physiology of vision to perceptual aesthetics to the technology of imaging systems. This is intended to be an interactive discussion, so please come prepared with your questions, comments, and contributions."
