You need to fill out an inventory sheet and should read the instructions which are available at the Carving Center or the Gallery. No more than 10% of the total articles at the show can be "not-for-sale". Gallery commission is 25%.

Artisans United News

The Artisans United Gallery Show, is fast approaching. The NVC agreed to join the Capital Area Woodturners in support of this Gallery Show. On July 17th from 7-9 PM there will be a reception to kick off the show and to celebrate the 15th Anniversary of the Artisans United.

The AU decided to continue its "Guild Play Day" on the first Tuesday from 10 AM to 5 PM of each month. This has proven popular. It provides an opportunity for guilds to have an open studio environment where folks from different guilds get a chance to work their favorite projects and mix with members of other guilds.

An Arts and Crafts Swap Meet is still planned for June 12th. NVC members are invited to participate. If you have any arts and crafts items you wish to get rid of, consider going. You can operate from your car trunk or from a card table you provide. There are no commissions or fees charged by the AU. For those interested in some good deals, you may consider dropping by.

Colvin Run Mill Program Starts June 6th

At our last meeting the new panels of cut-out blanks for the Colvin Run Mill were displayed. We now have three panels: red for ages 6-8; blue for ages 9-11; brown for ages 12 and up. Fewer selections are offered for each category. This should simplify the student choices and ease the number of blanks that need to be cutout and maintained. New tools purchased from the Artisans United grant were also displayed. We have added microplanes, several sets of flexcut gouges, and some chip carving knives.

Don't forget our woodcarving classes at the Mill start on June 6th. We will offer classes at the mill, free of charge, from **noon to 4 pm** on the first and third Sundays of June thru September. That's **June 6 & 20**, **July 4 & 18**, **August 1 & 15**, and **September 5 & 19**. Volunteers are especially needed on June 6, when a number of our regular instructors will be attending carving classes at Branson.

Ken Sheehan held a great workshop for prospective teachers at our last meeting. His handout was outstanding and you should try to pick one up the next time you are at Colvin Run. We wish to standardize our teaching program and the handout is an excellent guide.

As you know the Colvin Run Program is an excellent introduction to wood-carving for children, parents, and other interested adults. Recommend the program to your friends and acquaintances who want to learn woodcarving. Best yet, regardless of your skill level please consider volunteer teaching at these sessions. It may seem intimidating initially, but in reality the basics are very simple. Perhaps you will find you learn more than the pupils. You will undoubtedly find that you leave with a very self satisfied feeling of having introduced someone to this hobby.

Directions to the Carving Center/Meeting Room At George Mason High School

From I-495 Northern VA: Take exit for "VA-7 Leesburg Pike to Falls Church". Continue on VA-7, Leesburg Pike and go Southeast for approximately 1.8 miles to George Mason High School (on left), 7124 Leesburg Pike. Turn left onto Haycock, then take the next left, and find parking in one of the lots to the left. To Find the Carving Center Room (G024): On the western end (toward I-495) of the upper parking lot is a building marked Community Education Channel 38. Just to the left of this building is a sidewalk which leads to the back. Follow it, bear right across some grass and enter the Center (door on corner of building).
