June Program

For June we will continue our carving improvement series with an open discussion on finishing. When carvings are judged in our October 1st show, one of the main criteria is how well the piece is cleaned up and finished. John Sullivan and Mike Parker have volunteered to lead the discussion and talk about how they clean up and prepare their carvings for a finish. As most of our members know, both John and Mike seem to always achieve an great finish. Come hear how they do it.

At our May meeting JC Evans and Hap O'Brien discussed their clay modeling. JC showed us the clay models he used for his miniature owls and several bird carvings. Although he sometimes uses plasticine clay, JC prefers to use Sculpy, an oven hardening clay. Hap prefers water based terracotta clay. He discussed the making of a relief of an Apache chief, Victorio, an Allan Houser inspired Apache woman, and his Mohawk "Uncles" clay model that he plans to use for a future wood sculpture.

As you recall from the last newsletter, this is a simple beginner level carving project that can be completed in a relatively short period of time.

We had a good turnout of carvers to demonstrate Saturday, June 4th, at the Woodcraft Booth at Accotik Park for Heritage Days. Many thanks go to Pete Ward, Ernie Machate, Gary Lewis, Jim Ernst, Ray Stansel, and Hap O'Brien for representing NVC and Woodcraft. Al-

They are hoping to go well beyond that and are looking for local woodworkers to step up to the plate and get busy in their shops. The woodworkers guild will be taking care of remitting sales tax, so no need to worry over that point. They are trying to encourage the local woodworking community, including the carvers and the turners, to get into their shop and make something to show off to each other. This is a great opportunity for cross-pollination between the various woodworking groups.
