On April 28th, PSIA will be celebrating their 12th year in providing youth and family services in Southeast Pierce County. Who would ever have thought that just a handful of concerned parents and "kids" would make such a "Difference"?



I was hoping they would! I was going to start something for the kids — didn't know what — then step out within one year. Well, you can see that didn't happen!

March already! Let me share with you some of the things that happened in January and February, Friday nights are really booming around here, with youth participation on an increase. We are seeing an increase in family attendance during our family dinners, too. Lots of positive family interaction, and new families, too.

It is so much fun to see the families interacting, especially with the teens. The teens have been taking turns reading stories to the younger youth. They all sit around while the story is being read. Everyone is having a good time.

In the small room, we have what we call the "Kitchen Table". Here, we play games, do crafts and wait to see who comes to see us. Within a few minutes, youth of all ages, including the teens, pull up a chair and sit down with us. Sometimes they just want to visit. This is an excellent time for youth to feel a part of a family, by just being accepted.

On the same night, at the Eatonville Elementary School, you will find staff person Don Jacobs shooting hoops with the teens. There are a lot of youth activities going on in Eatonville on Friday nights. It is all thanks to our funders and to you....the SUPPORTERS that we count on.

The teens are becoming more active in the ownership of their program. They meet twice a month to discuss program activities. The first meeting is with the Teen Board and then we have a general meeting that includes all teens.

The first Friday night of the month, youth will perform Community Service Projects. This month through a request from one of our supporters, youth cleaned around the post office and library.

PSIA is your "Community Youth Making a Difference". When called upon by the community they continue to respond. These youth are great — come check us out.

Until next time....I continue to enjoy working with your youth — living in Southeast Pierce County.
