PSIA Offers 3 Summer Fun Programs Throughout Southeast Pierce County

It is with great privilege that PISA can offer the summer programs to the rural communities. We are very excited about our new program — the “WEST” program. The “WEST” program will offer free transportation and lunch for youth that are living out of town and who attend Weyerhaeuser Elementary School.

Programs are made possible through several grants. Funds for the Weyerhaeuser program allocates the cost of free transportation and lunch. These funds do not depend on a percentage of free and reduced lunches served at school.

Eatonville Elementary did not qualify for funds towards the summer lunch program this year. The percentage of free and reduced lunches served at school were too low. Funds for this program did depend on those percentages.
